

## High streamflow advisory

### Nordenskiold River - Carmacks

June 1, 2022 11:30 am

#### Current conditions

While the Nordenskiold River is still flowing near bankfull in some areas, flow has decreased since May 28 when the river peaked in response to combined rainfall and snowmelt input.

#### Weather forecast

Mainly sunny skies with highs in the mid-twenties and overnight lows above 7 degrees are expected for the rest of the week in Carmacks. Temperatures are forecast to cool off over the weekend with some isolated showers possible before warming again next week.

#### Water level forecast




Daily water level fluctuations are still expected as the remaining snowpack melts and water levels are likely to remain high into the weekend. In the absence of any significant rainfall, water levels are expected start to dropping more rapidly by next week.

#### Flood and travel advice

The public is advised to stay clear of the fast-flowing rivers and potentially unstable riverbanks during the high-streamflow period. Flood prone property owners are advised to have a plan in place in the event of a flood. See [Yukon.ca/floods](https://www.yukon.ca/floods) for more information.

We will continue to monitor conditions and will provide updates as conditions change.

#### Advisory and warning levels

-  **High streamflow or water advisory:** Lake levels or river flows or levels are rising or expected to rise rapidly, but no major flooding is expected. Minor flooding in low-lying areas is possible.
-  **Flood watch:** River or lake levels are rising and will approach or may exceed banks. Areas beside affected rivers and lakes may flood.
-  **Flood warning:** River or lake levels have exceeded or will exceed banks or flood stage very soon. Areas beside affected rivers and lakes will flood.
