

Consumer Price Index, November 2024

Released by Statistics Canada – December 17, 2024

Comparing November 2024 to November 2023, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 2.0% in Whitehorse (data are not available for Yukon). Whitehorse's year-over-year CPI change for the month of November 2024 (2.0%) was 0.1 percentage point higher than that for Canada (1.9%).

The main contributors to the year-over-year increase in Whitehorse CPI for the month of November 2024 were mortgage interest cost; food purchased from restaurants; and rent. Some of these increases were offset by price decreases in traveller accommodation; inter-city transportation; and passenger vehicle insurance premiums.

On a monthly basis, the CPI in Whitehorse was unchanged in November 2024 compared to October 2024; nationally, the CPI was also unchanged.
