



Employment Insurance, October 2024 (preliminary)

Released by Statistics Canada – December 18, 2024

In October 2024, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) receiving regular income support benefits¹ in Yukon was 560; of which, 370 were males and 190 were females. The total number of beneficiaries in October 2024 decreased by 20, or 3.4% compared to the October 2023 figure (580) and decreased by 10, or 1.8%, compared to the September 2024 preliminary figure (570).

Nationally, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) in October 2024 increased by 4.7% compared to October 2023 and increased by 0.1% from the September 2024 preliminary figure.

Notes to Readers:

- The number of regular EI beneficiaries for the current month and the previous month are subject to revision.
- The number of beneficiaries is a measure of all people who received regular EI benefits from October 13 to 19, 2024. This period coincides with the reference week of the Labour Force Survey.
- The number of beneficiaries represents a count of persons who qualified for employment insurance benefits during the Labour Force Survey reference week, usually containing the 15th day of the month.
- Figures are rounded to the nearest 10.

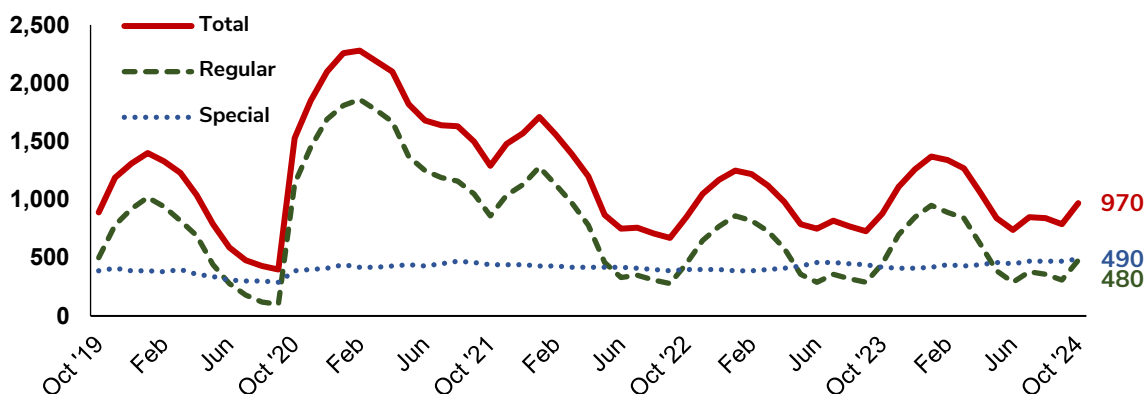
