



## Annual Wages, Salaries and Commissions, 2023

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In Yukon, 23,610 individuals aged 15 years and over filed a T1 Income Tax and Benefit Return and reported income from wages, salaries and commissions in 2023. The median annual income from wages, salaries and commissions in Yukon was \$59,950, the second highest in the country following the Northwest Territories (\$63,440).

In 2023, Yukon's median income from wages, salaries and commissions (\$59,950) increased by \$1,440, or 2.5% compared to 2022 (\$58,510); Nationally, median income from wages, salaries and commissions increased by \$2,270, or 5.0% over the same period. Compared to 2019, Yukon's median income from wages, salaries and commissions increased by \$10,620, or 21.5%; Nationally, median income increased by \$8,360, or 21.3%, between 2019 and 2023.

The 2023 median income from wages, salaries and commissions for male tax filers in Yukon (\$62,990) was the second highest in the country, following the Northwest Territories (\$64,990); and was \$8,220, or 15.0%, higher than that for male tax filers in Canada (\$54,770). The median income from wages, salaries and commissions for female tax filers in Yukon (\$57,700) was also the second highest in the country, following the Northwest Territories (\$61,770); and was \$16,060, or 38.6%, higher than that for female tax filers in Canada (\$41,640).

In 2023, the median income from wages, salaries and commissions of male tax filers in Yukon (\$62,990) was \$5,290, or 9.2%, higher than that of female tax filers (\$57,700). This translated into the third lowest median income disparity between males and females in Canada, following the Northwest Territories (5.2%) and Nunavut (6.1%). Nationally, the median income of male tax filers was 31.5% (\$13,130) higher than that of female tax filers.

**Note to readers:**

- All figures for previous years are in constant dollars and have been adjusted for inflation.
- Wages, salaries and commissions include employment pay and commissions as stated on T4 information slips, training allowances, tips, gratuities and royalties. It also includes tax-exempt employment income earned on an Indian reserve.
- Only tax filers 15 years of age and over, as of December 31 of the specified year, with wages, salaries and commissions are included.
- Data for this release are produced using the preliminary version of the T1 Family File (T1FF), which is based on an early version of the T1 file received by Statistics Canada from the Canada Revenue Agency.
- The T1 Family File will undergo a redesign starting with the 2024 reference year. The redesign is a statistical best practice that will increase the timeliness of the data, expand population coverage, and enhance precision at lower geographic levels. The release of the 2024 data, which would have occurred in spring 2026, will be delayed to winter 2026/2027.
