



## Infrastructure Economic Accounts, 2024

Released by Statistics Canada – June 13, 2025

According to estimates released by Statistics Canada, Yukon's 2024 investment in infrastructure assets was \$408 million (in 2017 dollars), an increase of \$24 million, or 6.3%, compared to 2023 (\$384 million).

On a per-capita basis, Yukon's investment in infrastructure assets was \$8,736 (in 2017 dollars) in 2024, an increase of \$289 dollars, or 3.4%, compared to 2023 (\$8,446). Yukon's 2024 per-capita investment in infrastructure assets was \$6,312 higher than the national average (\$2,424). Yukon had the highest per-capita investment in infrastructure assets of all provinces and territories.

#### Notes to readers:

- Infrastructure economic accounts asset classes include: commercial buildings, institutional buildings, marine engineering infrastructure, transportation engineering infrastructure, waterworks infrastructure, sewage infrastructure, communications networks, electric power infrastructure, oil and gas engineering construction, other engineering construction, other machinery and equipment, and transportation machinery and equipment.
- Total investment includes investments made by both the private sector and public sector.
- Per-capita investment figures are based on Statistics Canada's population estimates as of July 1<sup>st</sup> of each year.
