



Employment Insurance, June 2025 (preliminary)

Released by Statistics Canada – August 21, 2025

In June 2025, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) receiving regular income support benefits¹ in Yukon was 690; of which, 420 were men and 270 were women. The total number of beneficiaries in June 2025 (690) increased by 110, or 19.0%, compared to the June 2024 figure (580) and increased by 140, or 25.5%, compared to the May 2025 preliminary figure (550).

Nationally, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) in June 2025 increased by 12.8% compared to June 2024 and increased by 3.4% from the May 2025 preliminary figure.

Note to readers:

- Temporary flexibilities to the Employment Insurance (EI) Work-Sharing Program were announced on March 7, 2025, and additional EI measures were announced on March 22, 2025. To support affected businesses and their workers, special measures for the Work-Sharing Program are effective from March 7, 2025 to March 6, 2026. To support workers whose jobs are impacted by US tariffs, temporary measures that allow new claimants to receive EI benefits sooner are effective March 30 to October 11, 2025. In addition, temporary measures that adjust the number of hours needed for new claimants in some regions to receive EI benefits (effective April 6, 2025) were extended in July 2025 from July 12 to October 11, 2025.
- The number of regular EI beneficiaries for the current month and the previous month are subject to revision.
- The number of beneficiaries is a measure of all people who received regular EI benefits from June 15 to 21, 2025. This period coincides with the reference week of the Labour Force Survey.
- The number of beneficiaries represents a count of persons who qualified for employment insurance benefits during the Labour Force Survey reference week, usually containing the 15th day of the month.
- Figures are rounded to the nearest 10.

Canada, provinces and territories (seasonally adjusted)**

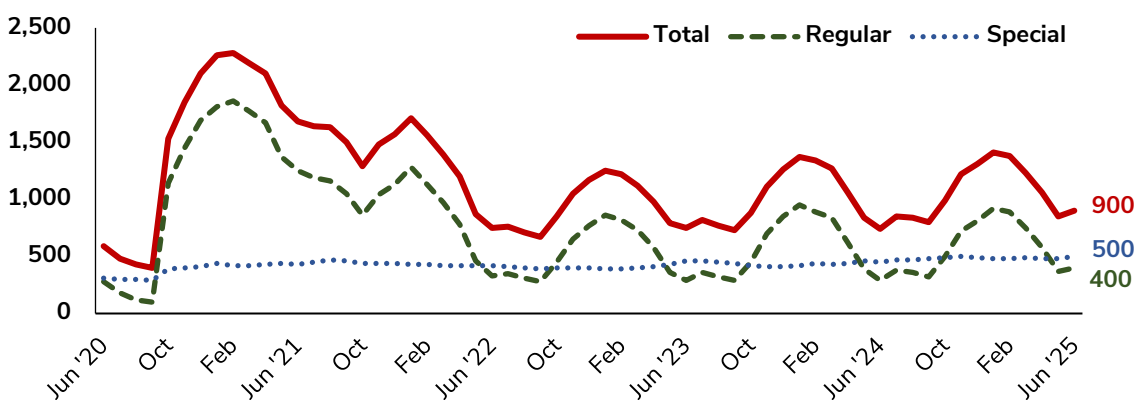
