



## Employment Insurance, July 2025 (preliminary)

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In July 2025, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) receiving regular income support benefits<sup>1</sup> in Yukon was 590; of which, 360 were men and 230 were women. The total number of beneficiaries in July 2025 (590) decreased by 10, or 1.7%, compared to the July 2024 figure (600) and decreased by 100, or 14.5%, compared to the June 2025 preliminary figure (690).

Nationally, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) in July 2025 increased by 12.8% compared to July 2024 and increased by 1.2% from the June 2025 preliminary figure.

#### Note to readers:

- In response to the impact of US tariffs, the Government of Canada (GC) introduced temporary special measures to the Employment Insurance (EI) Work-Sharing Program with effect from March 7, 2025 to March 6, 2026. In addition, GC announced additional temporary measures that include: (a) increasing regional unemployment rates used to determine hours needed to qualify for EI benefits for claims starting between April 6, 2025 and October 11, 2025; (b) eliminating the one-week waiting period for all new EI claims that start between March 30, 2025 and October 11, 2025; and (c) exempting earnings received from separation (e.g., severance or vacation pay) for claims starting between March 30, 2025 and October 11, 2025.
- The number of regular EI beneficiaries for the current month and the previous month are subject to revision.
- The number of beneficiaries is a measure of all people who received regular EI benefits from July 13 to 19, 2025. This period coincides with the reference week of the Labour Force Survey.
- The number of beneficiaries represents a count of persons who qualified for employment insurance benefits during the Labour Force Survey reference week, usually containing the 15th day of the month.
- Figures are rounded to the nearest 10.

Canada, provinces and territories (seasonally adjusted)**

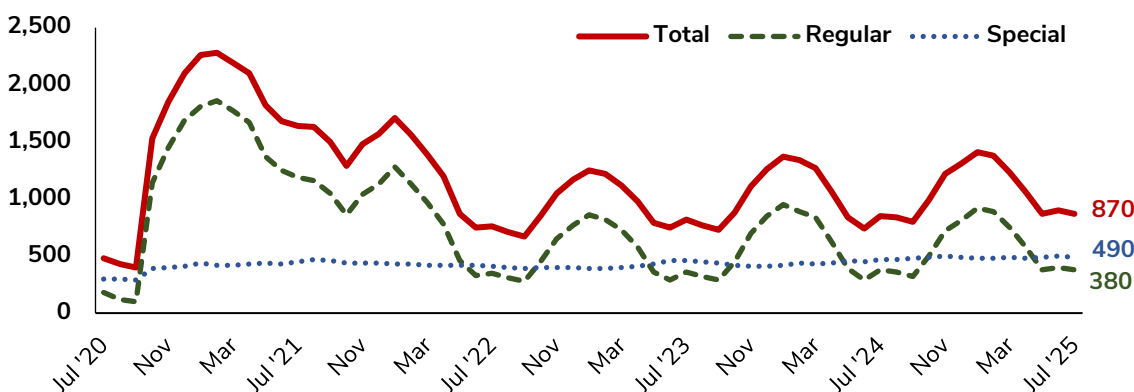
