



## Labour Force Survey, November 2025

Released by Statistics Canada – December 5, 2025

In November 2025, Yukon's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.3%. Canada's unemployment rate for the month was 6.5%.

Compared to the figures for October 2025, Yukon's seasonally adjusted labour force (28,200) decreased by 200; the number of employed (27,000) remained the same; the number of unemployed (1,200) decreased by 200; and the unemployment rate (4.3%) decreased by 0.6 percentage points.

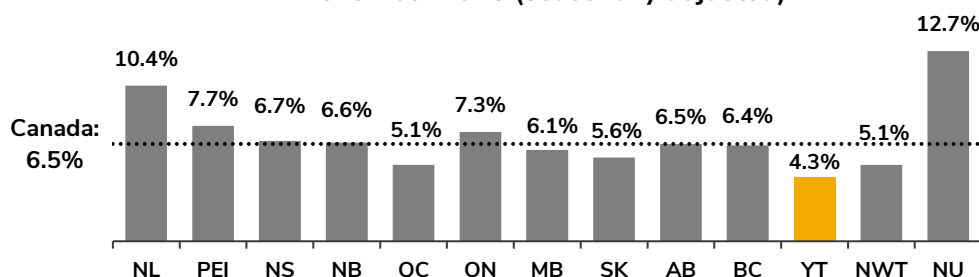
Compared to the figures for November 2024, Yukon's seasonally adjusted labour force (28,200) decreased by 500; the number of employed (27,000) remained the same; the number of unemployed (1,200) decreased by 500; and the unemployment rate (4.3%) decreased by 1.6 percentage points.

**Note to readers:**

- All estimates are rounded to the nearest hundred.
- All territories' monthly figures are based on three-month moving averages and are, therefore, not included in the overall figures for Canada.
- The Labour Force Survey (LFS) estimates for November reflect labour market conditions during the reference week of November 9 to 15, 2025.
- Every 10 years, the Labour Force Survey (LFS) sample is redesigned to reflect changes in population characteristics and updated geographical boundaries. The updated sample design — based on the 2021 Census population characteristics and the 2021 Standard Geographical Classification — was phased in during the period from April to September 2025.
