They will network and potentially work with organizations (e.g. CPAWS, BYTE, Rivers to Ridges, PSF, Yukon River Salmon Subcommittee, Yukon Fish and Wildlife Management Board, and others) to support opportunities for collaboration. They will attend events, meetings, or activities hosted by partner organizations and represent the program where appropriate. They will identify and support potential learning opportunities for youth with external groups (e.g. salmon conservation-related events and trainings). The Community Outreach and Salmon Ecology Intern will spend 30% of their time on ecological research to support research on topics such as two-eyed seeing, salmon life cycles, fisheries management, and the human relationship with salmon; contribute to educational materials or public facing summaries based on findings. 20% of the time will be spent on educational resource development including helping to create accessible and engaging content that shares ecological and cultural knowledge of salmon (e.g. podcast interviews with technical experts); collaborate with staff and other youth to test or refine materials; contribute to booth displays, workshop handouts, or other learning tools. 10% of the time will be spent on general administrative support such as participating in check-ins, work planning, and time management as well as assisting with documenting progress and communicating project updates.

Additionally, we dedicate significant resources and time to deliver STEAM and Trades programming in rural Yukon communities to support youth in exploring these fields.

This position is preferred to persons of Yukon First Nations ancestry and persons of Canadian Indigenous ancestry.
