



GDP by industry (at basic prices) 2024

Highlights:

- Yukon's real GDP by industry (at basic prices) in 2024 was \$3,223.2 million (in chained 2017 dollars), a decrease of \$82.6 million, or 2.5%, from the revised 2023 figure (\$3,305.8 million).
- In 2024, the largest dollar-amount gain was in the *Public administration* sector, with a \$29.7 million increase (up 3.8% from 2023), including \$15.6 million from the Indigenous public administration sub-sector.

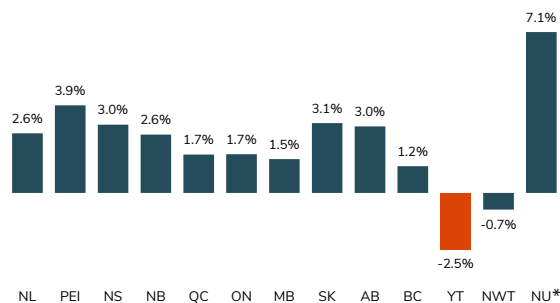
The GDP of an industry represents the value added by labour and capital in transforming inputs purchased from other industries into output. This analytical report presents Statistics Canada's latest estimates of Yukon's real GDP by industry at basic prices in chained (2017) dollars. Recent figures are subject to revision.

GDP is one of the primary economic indicators used by decision-makers within government, financial and other institutions to evaluate the health of the economy. A large growth in real GDP is interpreted as a sign that the economy is doing well, while a small or negative growth indicates poor economic performances.

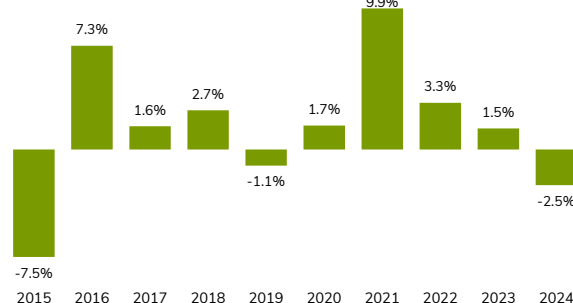
The current calculation of GDP is based on the input-output structure of the economy in 2022 (benchmark year). Substantial revisions in subsequent years can occur due to updated benchmark year.

All industries¹, Yukon, 2015 to 2024



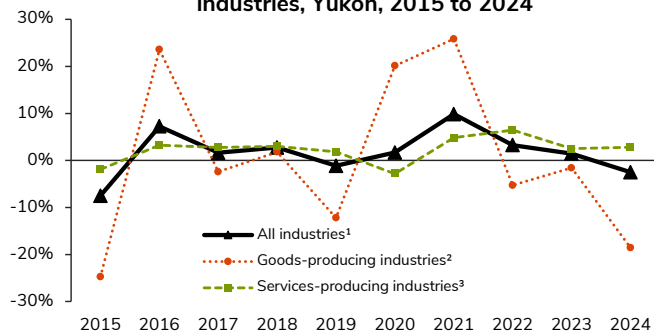
* Nunavut saw the highest growth rate at 7.1%, driven by a major gold mine project.

Over the 10-year period from 2015 to 2024, Yukon's GDP by industry (at basic prices) growth rate fluctuated significantly, ranging from a low of -7.5% in 2015 to a high of 9.9% in 2021.

Yukon's GDP by industry (at basic prices) contracted in 2015 (-7.5%) before rebounding strongly in 2016 (7.3%). Growth slowed in 2017 (1.6%) and 2018 (2.7%), followed by another decline in 2019 (-1.1%). After this contraction, GDP grew modestly in 2020 (1.7%) and then expanded sharply in 2021 (9.9%). Growth remained positive in 2022 (3.3%) and 2023 (1.5%) before declining again in 2024 (-2.5%).

In 2024, Yukon's GDP in the Goods-producing industries² decreased 18.5%, while GDP in the Services-producing industries³ increased 2.8%.

Between 2015 and 2024, GDP growth rates for the Goods-producing industries² showed substantial volatility, ranging from -24.7% in 2015 to 25.8% in 2021. These large fluctuations were driven primarily by changes in outputs of the Metal ore mining industry group, with additional contributions from changes in the Construction sector's output. In comparison, the Services-producing industries³ grew within a much narrower band over the same period, with growth rates ranging from -2.8% in 2020 to 6.4% in 2022.

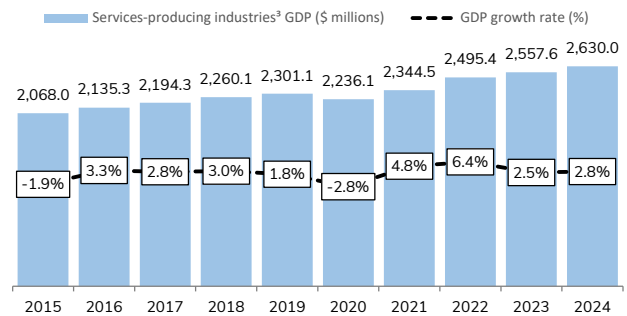
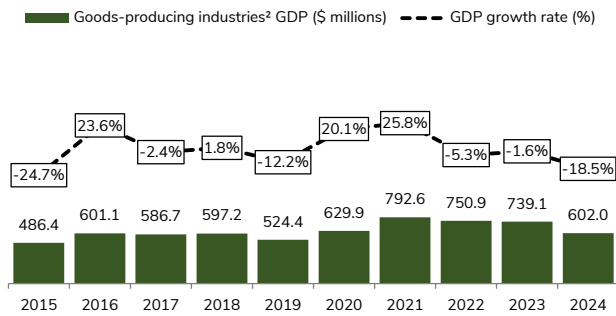

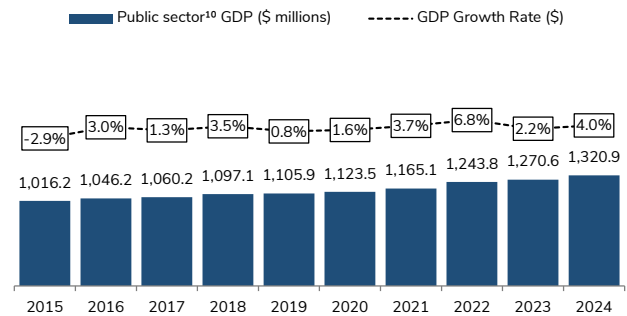
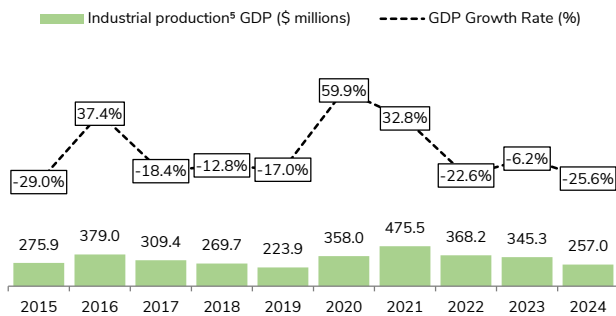

During the period from 2015 to 2024, as a proportion of total GDP, the Goods-producing sector ranged from a low of 18.7% in 2019 to a high of 27.0% in 2021.

In the period from 2015 to 2024, as a proportion of total GDP, the Services-producing sector ranged from a low of 73.0% in 2021 to a high of 81.3% in 2019.



In 2024, the GDP contributed by the Industrial production sector was \$257.0 million, a decrease of \$88.3 million, or 25.6%, compared to 2023 (\$345.3 million) and a decrease of \$18.9 million, or 6.9%, compared to 2015 (\$275.9 million).

In 2024, the GDP contributed by the Public sector was \$1,320.9 million, an increase of \$50.3 million, or 4.0%, compared to 2023 (\$1,270.6 million) and an increase of \$304.7 million, or 30.0%, compared to 2015 (\$1,016.2 million).

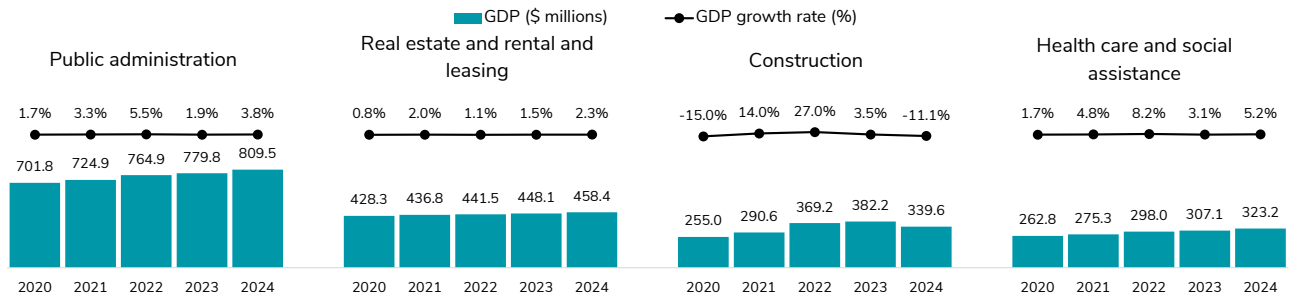

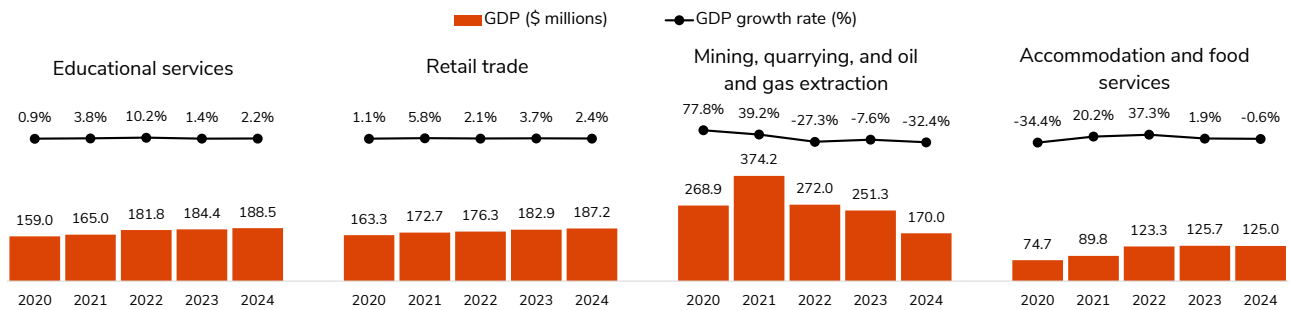

GDP output and growth rate, by NAICS, Yukon (chained 2017 dollars)

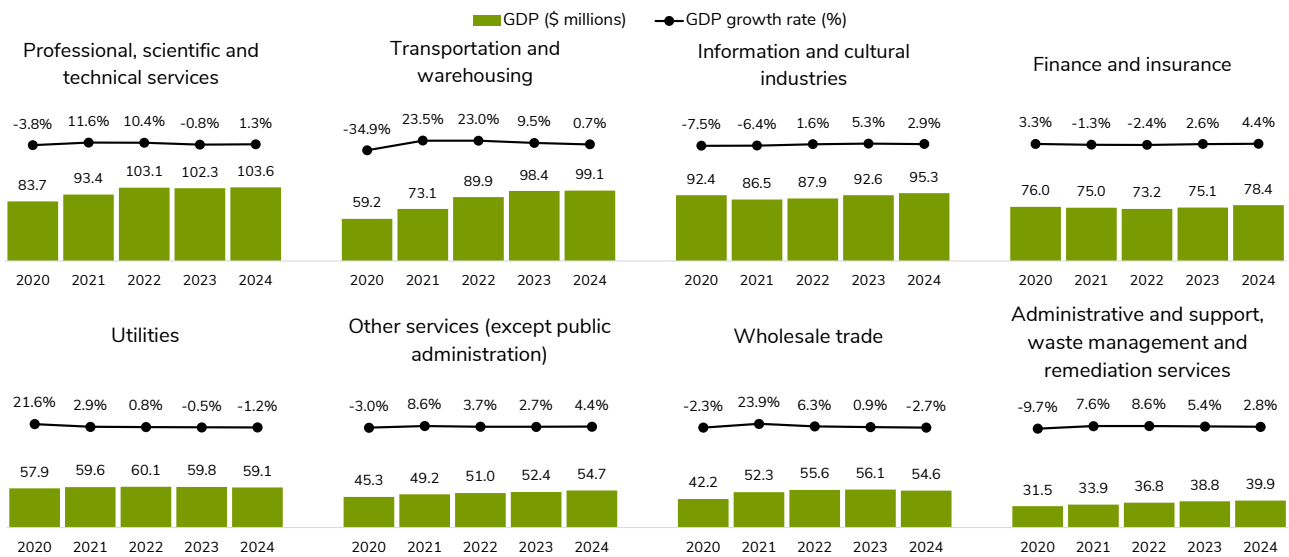
Sectors with GDP of \$300 million or more, 2020 to 2024



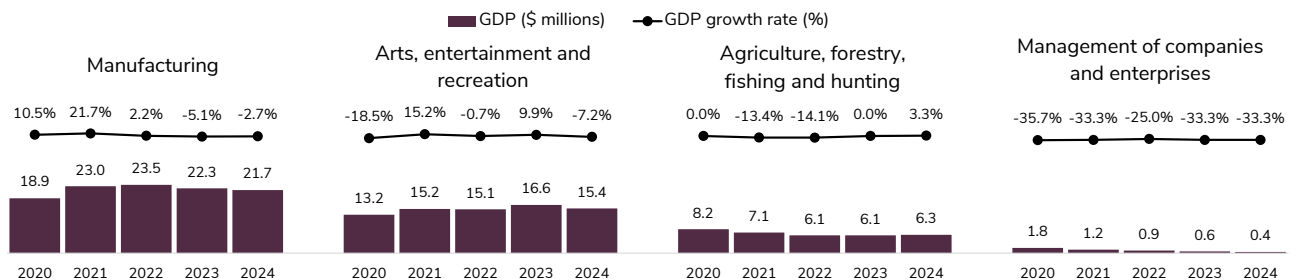
Sectors with GDP of \$125 million or more but less than \$300 million, 2020 to 2024

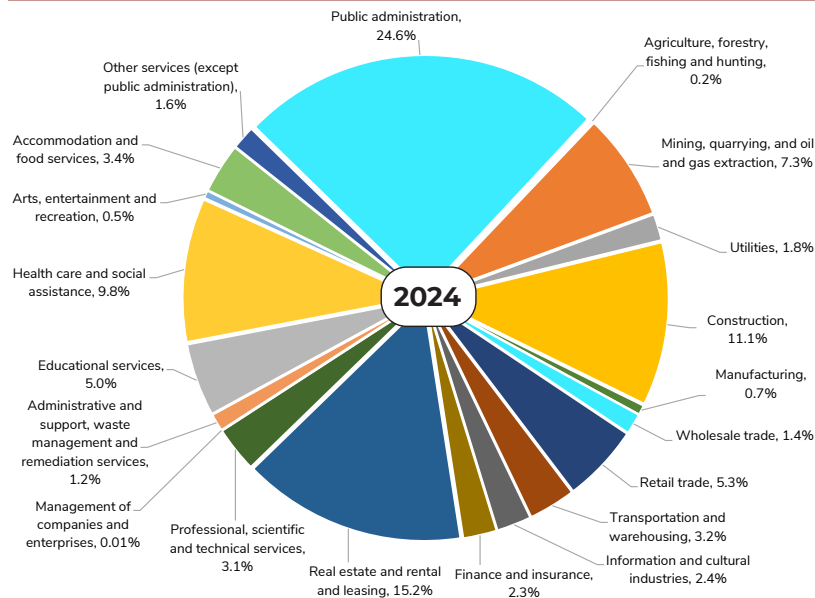

Major contributors to Yukon GDP by sector in 2024 were:

- Public administration (24.6%);
- Real estate and rental and leasing (15.2%);
- Construction (11.1%);
- Health care and social assistance (9.8%);
- Mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction (7.3%); and
- Retail trade (5.3%).

Endnotes:

- Statistics Canada uses the chain Fisher volume index method of calculating the real GDP. This method was adopted as it produces the most accurate measure of growth in GDP and its components, and the change brings the Canadian measure in line with the US quarterly Income and Product Accounts which also use the chain Fisher formula to measure real GDP. An important consequence of using chain indexes is that the associated volume measures are not additive. That is, the sum of the chained values for each component of an aggregate does not equal the chained value of the aggregate. For example, the sum of the components of the *Transportation & Warehousing Industry* is not equal to the number given for that industry, just as the sum of the individual industry sectors is not equal to the number given for *All Industries*. - The most recent benchmark year for which the input-output structure of Yukon's economy is measured is 2022 and therefore it is the most current year for which the contributions of different industries to GDP may be accurately measured. GDP calculations for subsequent years are projections based on the structure of Yukon's economy in 2022 and changes in prices and output volumes in intervening years. Substantial revisions to these estimates can occur if there are major changes to the structure of the economy; for example, the opening or closing of a large mine after the most recent input/output accounts reference year.
- Provincial and territorial gross domestic product (GDP) by industry data are derived using the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Canada 2022 version 1.0. As a result, data presented in this publication are not fully comparable with those previously published.
