



Labour Force Survey, December 2025 January 9, 2026

In December 2025, Yukon's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.3%. Canada's unemployment rate for the month was 6.8%.

Compared to the figures for November 2025, Yukon's seasonally adjusted labour force (27,900) decreased by 300; the number of employed (26,700) decreased by 300; the number of unemployed (1,200) remained the same; and the unemployment rate (4.3%) was unchanged.

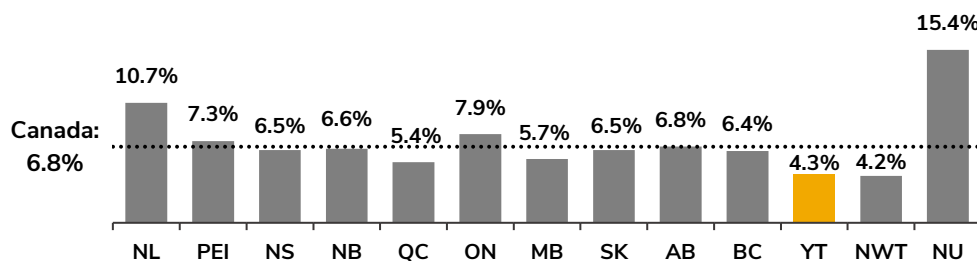
Compared to the figures for December 2024, Yukon's seasonally adjusted labour force (27,900) decreased by 700; the number of employed (26,700) decreased by 500; the number of unemployed (1,200) decreased by 100; and the unemployment rate (4.3%) decreased by 0.2 percentage points.

Note to readers:

- All estimates are rounded to the nearest hundred.
- All territories' monthly figures are based on three-month moving averages and are, therefore, not included in the overall figures for Canada.
- The Labour Force Survey (LFS) estimates for December reflect labour market conditions during the reference week of December 7 to 13, 2025.
- Every 10 years, the Labour Force Survey (LFS) sample is redesigned to reflect changes in population characteristics and updated geographical boundaries. The updated sample design — based on the 2021 Census population characteristics and the 2021 Standard Geographical Classification — was phased in during the period from April to September 2025.
