

Labour Force Survey, January 2025

Released by Statistics Canada – February 7, 2025

In January 2025, Yukon's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.5%. Canada's unemployment rate for the month was 6.6%.

Compared to the figures for December 2024, Yukon's seasonally adjusted labour force (28,600) remained the same; the number of employed (27,300) increased by 100; the number of unemployed (1,300) remained the same; and the unemployment rate (4.5%) also remained the same.

Compared to the figures for January 2024, Yukon's seasonally adjusted labour force (28,600) increased by 2,000; the number of employed (27,300) increased by 1,800; the number of unemployed (1,300) increased by 200; and the unemployment rate (4.5%) increased by 0.4 percentage points.
