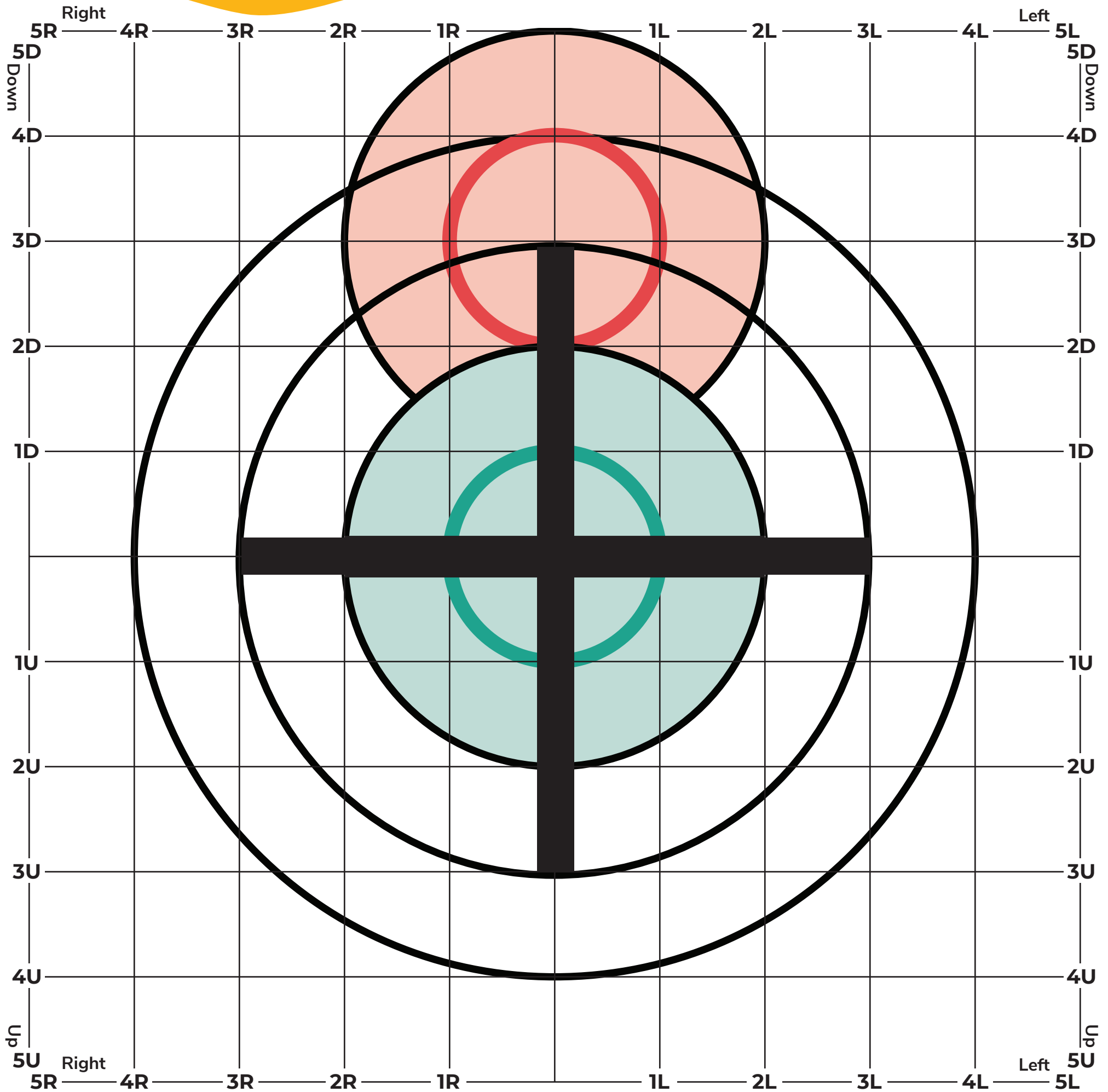


Wood bison hunters, make your shot count

Set your sights before heading out



Minimum firearm requirements

Centrefire rifle

Premium ammunition is highly recommended, designed for large or dangerous game and loaded with expanding copper, bonded, or partition-constructed bullets).

- **.30 calibre** or larger.
- **Minimum 180 grain bullets.**
- **Minimum 2,800 ft/lbs energy** at the muzzle.

A .30-06 calibre rifle with 180 grain bullets meets the minimum legal requirements but is not recommended.

How to approach a downed animal

Approach from the spine side, and make sure there's no movement of the chest or limbs. Use your firearm or a long stick to touch the eyeball. If the animal blinks, it's still alive. Kill it humanely with a single shot to the area where the base of the skull meets the neck. Make the shot at close range. Site down the barrel of your firearm; don't use your scope for this shot.

Sighting in at 50 yards or closer

1. Align the cross-hairs of your scope or open sights with the cross on the target and fire three rounds with the same load you will use when hunting.
2. Use the adjustments on your scope or open sights and the one inch squares of the target to adjust the centre of your three round group until your shots are consistently in the centre of the bull's eye in the area of the **GREEN circle**.

Sighting in at 100 yards

1. Align the cross-hairs of your scope with the cross on the target and fire three rounds with the same load you will use when hunting.
2. Use the adjustments on your scope and the one inch squares of the target to adjust the centre of your three round group until your shots are consistently 3 inches high of the centre on the bull's eye in the area of the **RED circle**.
