



APPLICATION TO TRANSPORT DOMESTIC SHEEP OR GOATS INTO YUKON WITHOUT PRE-IMPORT TESTING

PURSUANT TO CLAUSE 13, CONTROL ORDER 2018-001

Anyone transporting domestic sheep or goats into Yukon must submit a completed copy of this application to the Government of Yukon's Agriculture Branch for approval. Once approved, a copy must be carried during transport.

Use this application form if you are importing domestic sheep and goats WITHOUT pre-import testing. These animals will be placed under a quarantine order on arrival in the Yukon and you will not be eligible to apply for compensation if these animals test positive for respiratory pathogens.

- An inventory of animals must be completed and recorded on the certificate of loading document. Any discrepancies with the species, number or origin of animals listed on the permit must be reported to the Animal Health Unit (867-667-5600) at the time of loading.
- Every animal loaded for transport must be fit for the trip and treated humanely. Refer to the Government of Canada's Health of Animals Regulations Part XII: Transportation of Animals.
- To accommodate highway safety and animal care; fuel and driver rest stops of reasonable duration are authorized as necessary.
- In the event of the escape of sheep/goats during transport within Yukon, the permit holder shall contact Agriculture Branch at 867-667-5838 as soon as possible. Document the time, date and location of the escaped animal to include with the loading certificate.
- The import permit and the certificate(s) of loading must accompany the shipment and be produced for inspection by an animal health inspector upon request. In the case of shipping by air, the certificate of loading must be affixed to the travel crate containing the animal.
- The permit holder must notify the Agriculture Branch by email (agriculture@gov.yk.ca) within 72 hours of arrival at the destination premises.
- The person(s) unloading the animals must verify that the inventory of animals corresponds to the certificate(s) of loading and contact Agriculture Branch as soon as possible of any discrepancy.
- Upon unloading, the animals are to be placed in the approved designated quarantine area and will be will be subject to the conditions of quarantine order: _____.
- Any evidence of respiratory illness (coughing, discharge from nose, laboured breathing) must be reported to the Animal Health Unit by calling 867-667-5600.
- Within fourteen (14) working days of arrival in Yukon, an animal health inspector will visit the animals at the destination premises. At that visit, or at a subsequent visit, the animal health inspector will place/confirm individual identifications and collect samples to test for respiratory pathogens.
- You will not be eligible to apply for compensation if the animals test positive for respiratory pathogens while under the quarantine order.
- This permit is not transferable and failing to comply with a condition of the permit constitutes an offence under the *Animal Health Act*.
