- Responsible for examining and registering the documents that transfer and affect interests in land, such as mortgages, liens and discharges; also examines and registers all survey plans for the Yukon.
- Responsible for issuing Certificates of Title, guaranteed by Government of Yukon, that are evidence of ownership interests in land.

In the period April 1, 2024 to November 30, 2024, the Land Titles Office issued Certificates of Title for 25 First Nations Settlement land.

² Miscellaneous documents includes Easements, Transmission Applications, Name Changes, Affidavits, Writs of Seizure and Sale, etc.

³ This number remains relatively static because generally, whenever a title is issued, the previous title is cancelled. Some transactions (such as the registration of a condominium development) result in more than one title being issued. The actual number of active titles will change as new subdivisions and condominium developments are created.

⁴ The Yukon Land Titles Registry online search portal opened to the public on December 1, 2021. Since then customers have been able to obtain title searches, General Register Certificates and other information online.

COMMUNITY JUSTICE AND PUBLIC SAFETY Yukon Community Corrections

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

- Yukon Community Corrections administers community based corrections programs and services. These programs and services enable the courts to consider a range of alternatives to imprisonment in the sentencing process. They are designed primarily for medium and high risk offenders and based on the characteristics, traits, problems or issues of an individual that directly relate to the individual's likelihood to reoffend and commit another crime.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

- The Whitehorse Correctional Centre is a multi-level security facility for adult men and women. The centre accommodates inmates serving sentences of less than two years, individuals remanded to custody pending judicial interim release, parole violations, immigration holds, and people who are found not criminally responsible (by order of the Yukon Review Board).

Territorial police services are cost-shared between Canada and Yukon at 70 per cent Yukon, 30 per cent Canada.

These reports identify all offences contained within each occurrence, i.e. one call for service may generate more than one offence (example: an Assault complaint can also generate a Fail to Comply with Probation Order charge).

- 1 Actual offences are the total reported offences minus all Unfounded offences. "Unfounded" means that police completed an investigation and have established that an offence did not happen or was not attempted.
- 2 Impaired Driving information includes both impaired operation and impaired care or control offences whether the impairment is a result of alcohol and/or drug use.
- 3 ACTUAL for current Year is from April 1 to November 30, 2025. Forecast for the current year is derived by adding the number of occurrences from December 1, 2024 to March 31, 2025.
