



## Survey of Employment, Payrolls and Hours 2025

### Highlights:

- In 2025, Yukon had 25,332 employees (including employees in industry-unclassified businesses). Comparing 2025 to 2024, the number of employees (including employees in unclassified businesses) decreased by 79, or 0.3%.
- Excluding unclassified businesses, in 2025, Yukon had 24,807 employees and their average weekly earnings (including overtime) was \$1,496.14, an increase of \$48.07, or 3.3%, compared to 2024.
- The **Public administration** sector — including federal, territorial, municipal and Indigenous governments — remained the largest employer in 2025, with 8,163 employees, or 32.9% of all employees in classified businesses in Yukon.

### About the survey

The Survey of Employment, Payrolls and Hours (SEPH) provides a portrait of the amount of earnings, as well as the number of payroll jobs (i.e., occupied positions) and hours worked by detailed industry. A combination of payroll deduction accounts (provided to Statistics Canada by the Canada Revenue Agency) and the Business Payrolls Survey (BPS) is used to produce these estimates.

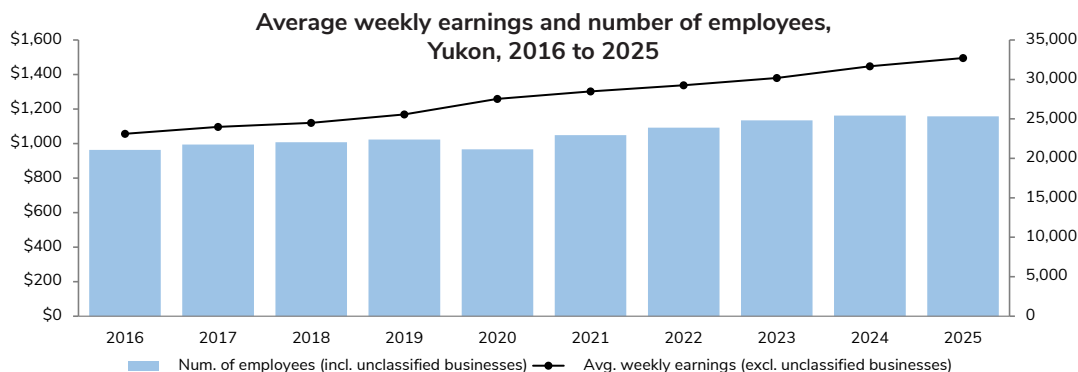

In 2025, the number of Yukon employees (including those in unclassified businesses) decreased by 79, or 0.3%, compared to 2024, while average weekly earnings (excluding earnings by employees in unclassified businesses and including overtime) increased by \$48.07, or 3.3%.

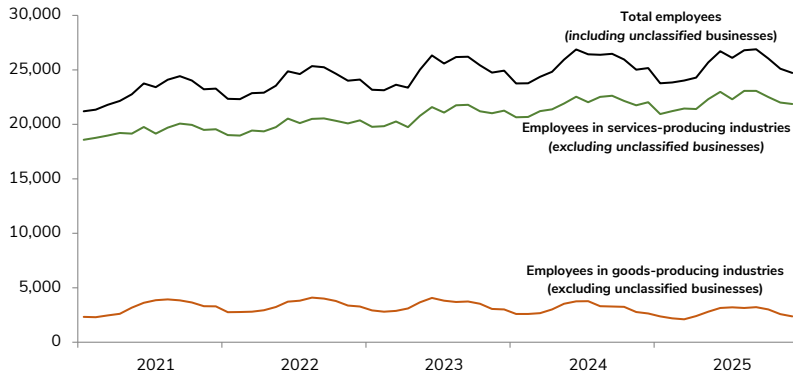
Comparing 2025 to 2016, the number of employees in Yukon increased by 4,260, or 20.2%, while average weekly earnings (excluding unclassified businesses and including overtime) increased by \$439.04, or 41.5%.

Employment in Yukon exhibits a seasonal pattern, typically rising during the spring and summer months, and declining in the fall and winter. The number of employees is typically higher in June through September, and lower in January and February.

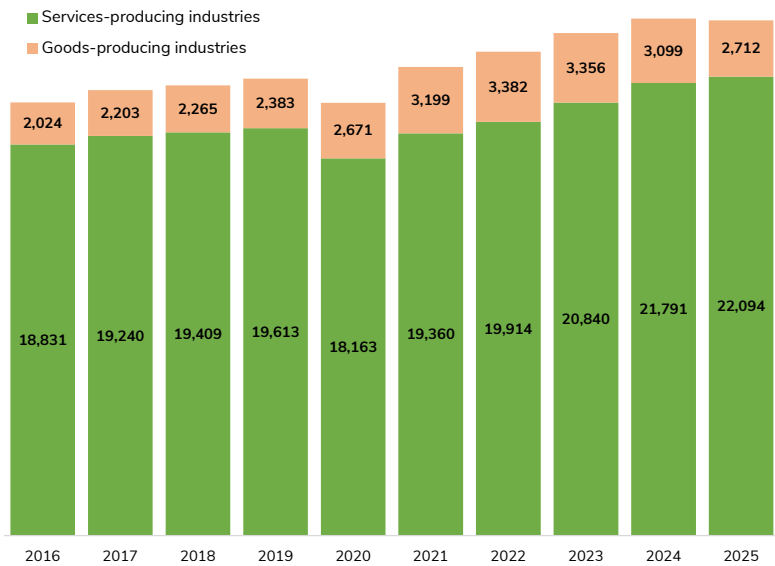
In 2025, the proportion of total employees in Yukon's Goods-producing industries was the highest in July (12.6%), while the proportion in Services-producing industries was the highest in March (91.1%).

## Goods-producing vs. services-producing industries employment, Yukon, 2016 to 2025

Comparing 2025 to 2024, the number of employees in Services-producing industries increased by 303, or 1.4%, while that in Goods-producing industries decreased by 387, or 12.5%.

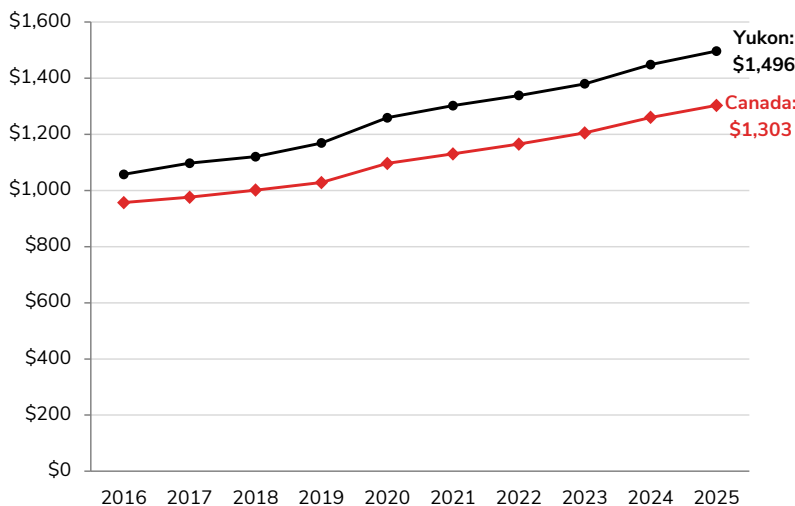
In the last decade (2016 to 2025), employment in Goods-producing industries as a proportion of total employment ranged from a low of 9.7% in 2016 to a high of 14.5% in 2022.

From 2016 to 2022, growth in mining and construction increased the proportion of employment in Goods-producing industries. Since 2023, employment in Goods-producing industries has steadily declined, while employment in Services-producing industries has continued to grow, resulting in a reduced share of total employment in Goods-producing industries.

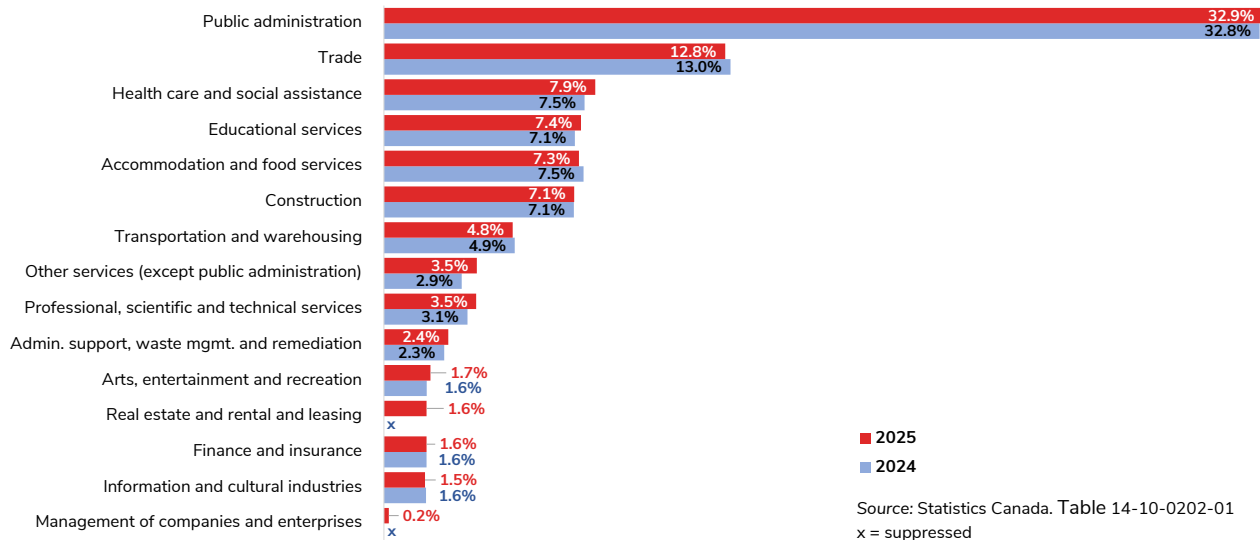

Comparing 2025 to 2024, the average weekly earnings of Yukon employees (excluding earnings by employees in unclassified businesses and including overtime) increased by \$48.07, or 3.3%, while the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for Whitehorse<sup>2</sup> increased 3.2%.

Comparing 2025 to 2016, Yukon's earnings increased by \$439.04, or 41.5%, while the Whitehorse CPI increased 30.5%. During the same time period, Canada's earnings increased by \$346.25, or 36.2%, while the national CPI rose 27.9%.

Yukon's average weekly earnings (including overtime) have consistently been higher than the national average. In 2025, Yukon's average weekly earnings (\$1,496.14) was \$193.28, or 14.8%, higher than Canada's (\$1,302.86).

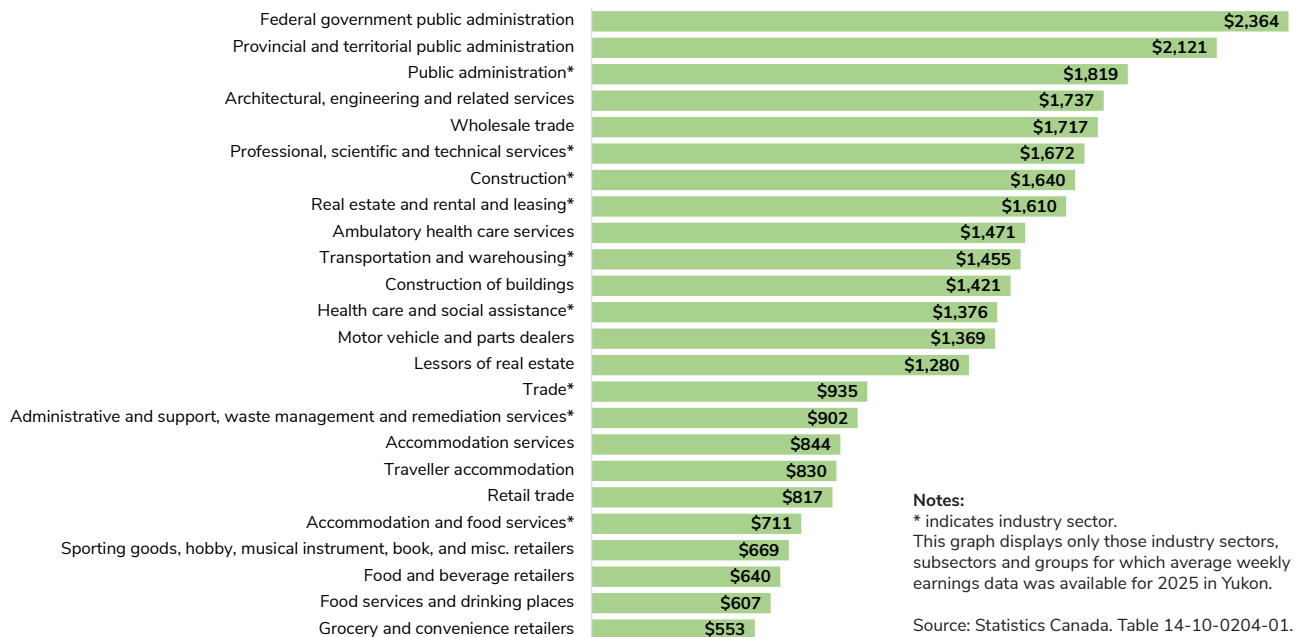
## Employment by industry sector, Yukon, 2024 and 2025



The **Public administration** sector — including federal, territorial, municipal and Indigenous governments — remained the territory's largest employer in 2025, representing 32.9% of total employees in Yukon. The distribution of the total number of employees by industry sector did not change substantially from 2024 to 2025.

Excluding **Other services**, the largest change was in the **Health care and social assistance** sector, with an increase of 0.4 percentage points in the proportion of employees in 2025 compared to 2024.

## Average weekly earnings (including overtime) by selected industry sector and subsector, Yukon, 2025



In 2025, the industry sector with the highest average weekly earnings<sup>1</sup> was the **Public administration** sector (\$1,818.95) followed by the **Professional, scientific and technical services** sector (\$1,672.01) and the **Construction** sector (\$1,640.05).

Of industry subsectors, the highest average weekly earnings<sup>2</sup> was in the **Federal government public administration** subsector (\$2,364.35) followed by the **Territorial public administration** subsector (\$2,121.00) and the **Architectural, engineering and related services** subsector (\$1,737.49).

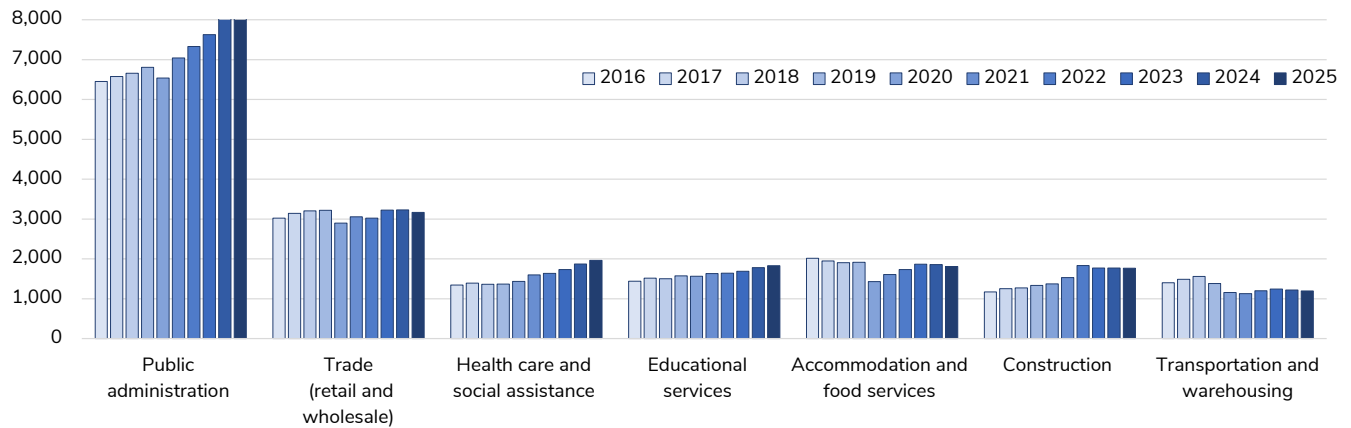

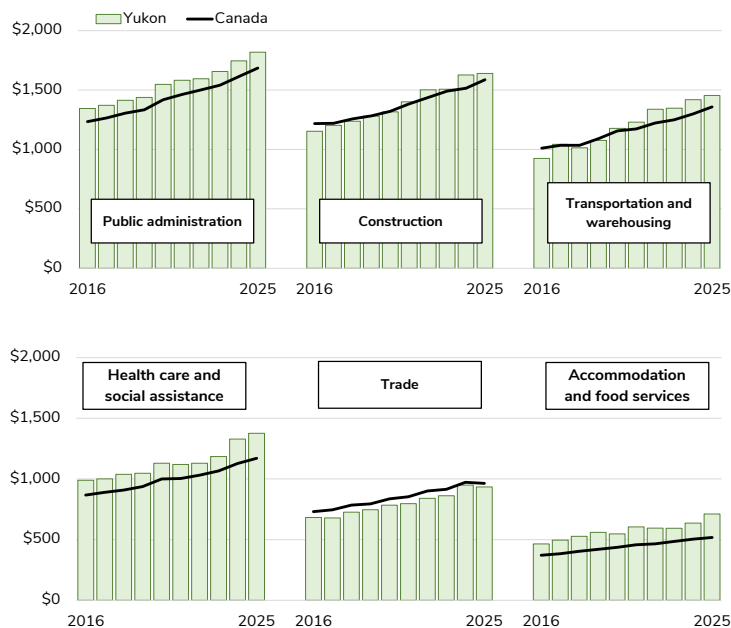
Yukon data for the number of employees in 2025 were available for fifteen industry sectors. Of those, seven sectors employed over 1,000 employees: **Public administration** (8,163 employees); **Trade** (3,168); **Health care and social assistance** (1,962); **Educational services** (1,829); **Accommodation and food services** (1,811); **Construction** (1,767); and **Transportation and warehousing** (1,195). These seven sectors collectively represented 80.2% of all classified businesses' employees in the territory.

The **Public administration** sector — including federal, territorial, municipal and Indigenous governments — was the largest employer in 2025, with 8,163 employees, or 32.9%, of all employees in classified businesses.

Among other industry sectors: **Trade (Retail and Wholesale)** represented 12.8% of all employees in classified businesses; **Health care and social assistance**, 7.9%; **Educational services**, 7.4%; **Accommodation and food services**, 7.3%; **Construction**, 7.1%; and **Transportation and warehousing**, 4.8%.

In 2025, Yukon data on average weekly earnings (including overtime) were available for nine industry sectors, excluding unclassified businesses.

Of Yukon's industry sectors with over 1,000 employees and available data, the sectors with the highest average weekly earnings were:

- **Public administration** (\$1,818.95);
- **Construction** (\$1,640.05);
- **Transportation and warehousing** (\$1,454.77);
- **Health care and social assistance** (\$1,375.85);
- **Trade** (\$934.71); and
- **Accommodation and food services** (\$710.95).

In 2025, Yukon's average weekly earnings were higher than the national average in the following top industry sectors:

- **Health care and social assistance** (\$205.97, or 17.6% higher);
- **Accommodation and food services** (\$192.96, or 37.3% higher);
- **Public administration** (\$133.41, or 7.9% higher);
- **Transportation and warehousing** (\$96.79, or 7.1% higher); and
- **Construction** (\$53.73, or 3.4% higher).

Of sectors employing over 1,000 people and with available data, only **Trade** sectors had average weekly earnings lower than the national average (\$29.47, or 3.1% lower).

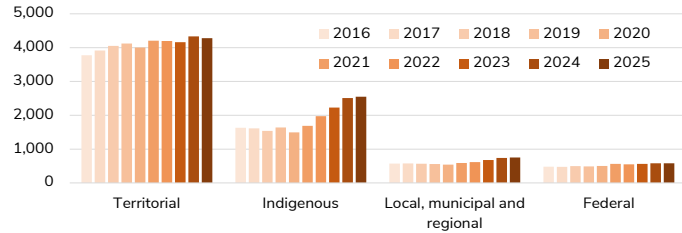
## Employment and earnings (including overtime) for Public administration sector, Yukon, 2016 to 2025

**Note:** Public administration includes only the establishments engaged in activities that are governmental in character and those providing services as agencies internal to the public service. Government-owned establishments primarily engaged in activities assigned to other industries are classified in those industries, (i.e. Education and Health) along with similar establishments owned by non-government bodies. Therefore, employment, earnings and hours data included in Public administration do not represent the actual total number of persons employed by government at every level.

### Employment within Public administration sector, Yukon, 2016 to 2025

In 2025, the top employer in Yukon was the **Public administration** sector with 8,163 employees. The largest subsector was the **Territorial public administration** with 4,281 employees, representing 52.4% of public administration employment.

Employment in the **Territorial public administration** subsector has increased by 506, or 13.4%, compared to the 2016 level (3,775).

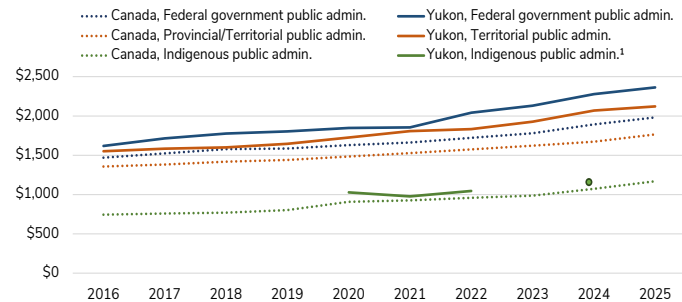


### Earnings for available Public administration subsectors, Canada and Yukon, 2016 to 2025

The average weekly earnings in 2025 in the **Territorial public administration** subsector in Yukon was \$355.86, or 20.2%, higher than the average for provincial and territorial public administrations.

The average earnings in the **Federal public administration** subsector in Yukon was \$382.76, or 19.3%, higher than the national average.

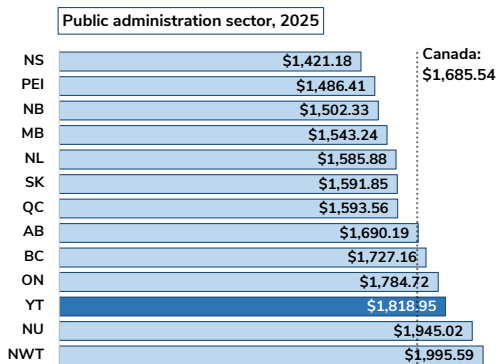
Comparing 2025 to 2024, the average earnings in Yukon's **Territorial public administration** subsector increased by \$51.08, or 2.5%; comparing 2025 to 2016, earnings increased by \$569.58, or 36.7%.

## Average weekly earnings (including overtime) for Public administration sector and provincial/territorial public administration subsector, Canada, provinces and territories, 2025



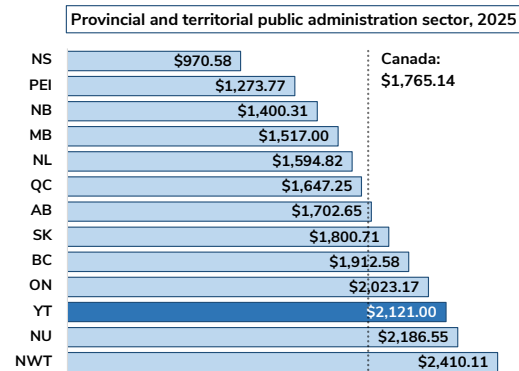

In 2025, Yukon's average weekly earnings (including overtime) in the **Public administration** sector was \$1,818.95. This was the third-highest among provinces and territories, following Nunavut (\$1,945.02) and the Northwest Territories (\$1,995.59).

Yukon's average weekly earnings in the **Public administration** sector was \$176.64, or 8.9%, lower than that of the Northwest Territories (\$1,995.59), while it was \$397.77, or 28.0%, higher than that of Nova Scotia (\$1,421.18), the province with the lowest average weekly earnings in the **Public administration** sector in 2025.

The 2025 average weekly earnings in Yukon's **Provincial/Territorial public administration** subsector (\$2,121.00) ranked the third-highest in the country in 2025, following Nunavut (\$2,186.55) and the Northwest Territories (\$2,410.11).

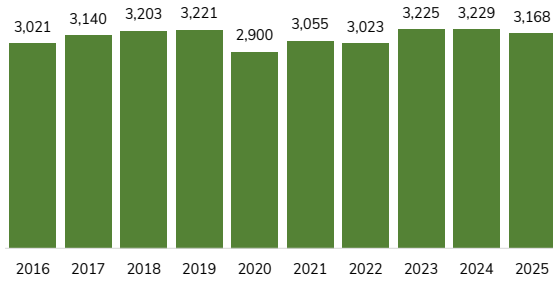
Yukon's average weekly earnings in the **Provincial/Territorial public administration** subsector was \$289.11, or 12.0%, lower than that of the Northwest Territories (\$2,410.11), while it was \$1,150.42, or 118.5%, higher than that of Nova Scotia (\$970.58).

### Employment in Trade sectors, Yukon, 2016 to 2025



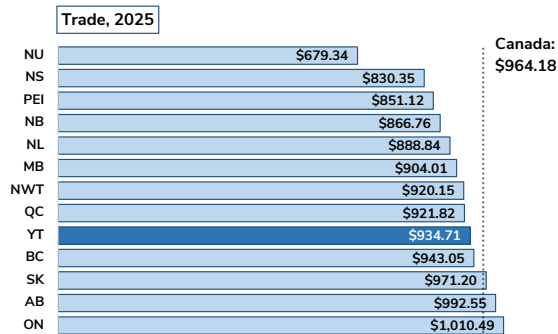
In 2025, the second-largest number of workers in Yukon were employed in aggregated (Retail and Wholesale) Trade sectors (3,168 employees).

Comparing 2025 to 2016, employment in Trade sectors increased by 147, or 4.9%. Comparatively, total employment increased 20.2% during the same period.

Compared to 2024, employment in Trade sectors decreased by 61, or 1.9%, in 2025.

Yukon's 2025 average weekly earnings (including overtime) in Trade sectors (\$934.71) was the fifth-highest of all jurisdictions. However, compared to the national average earnings for the sector (\$964.18), Yukon's average earnings was \$29.47, or 3.1% lower.

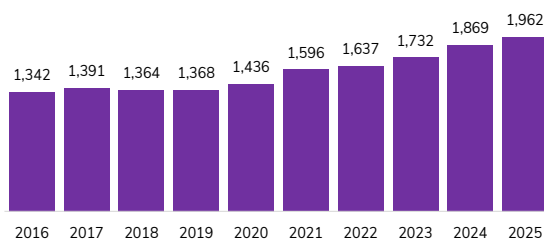
In 2025, Yukon's average weekly earnings in Trade sectors (\$934.71) was \$75.78, or 7.5%, lower than Ontario (\$1,010.49) and \$255.37, or 37.6%, higher than Nunavut (\$679.34).

The average earnings in Trade sectors was \$561.43, or 37.5%, less than earnings for Yukon's industrial aggregate (excluding unclassified businesses and including overtime).

### Employment in Health care and social assistance sector, Yukon, 2016 to 2025



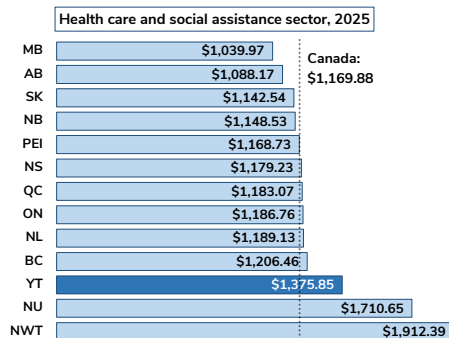
In 2025, the third-largest number of workers in Yukon were employed in the Health care and social assistance sector (1,962 employees).

During the period from 2016 to 2019, employment in the Health care and social assistance sector ranged between 1,342 and 1,391. Beginning in 2019, employment in the Health care and social assistance sector steadily increased reaching a high of 1,962 employees in 2025.

Comparing 2025 to 2016, employment in the Health care and social assistance sector increased by 620, or 46.2%. Comparing 2025 to 2024, employment in this sector increased by 93, or 5.0%.

Yukon's 2025 average weekly earnings (including overtime) in the Health care and social assistance sector (\$1,375.85) was the third-highest of all jurisdictions. Compared to Canada (\$1,169.88), Yukon's earnings was \$205.97, or 17.6% higher.

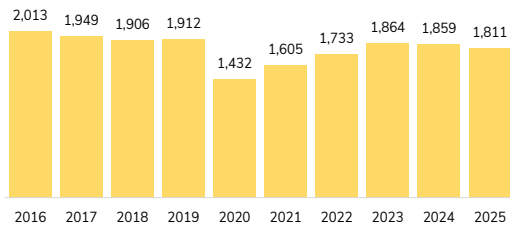
In 2025, Yukon's average weekly earnings in the Health care and social assistance sector (\$1,375.85) was \$536.54, or 28.1%, lower than the Northwest Territories (\$1,912.39) and \$335.88, or 32.3%, higher than Manitoba (\$1,039.97).

The average earnings in the Health care and social assistance sector was \$120.29, or 8.0%, less than earnings for Yukon's industrial aggregate (excluding unclassified businesses and including overtime).

### Employment in Accommodation and food services sector, Yukon, 2016 to 2025



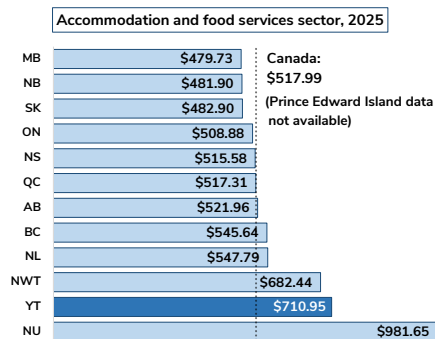

In 2025, Yukon's Accommodation and food services sector employed 1,811 workers, making it Yukon's fifth-largest employment sector.

Since 2016, employment in the Accommodation and food services sector has an overall downward trend. This decline was gradual from 2016 to 2019, followed by a sharp decrease in 2020 due to pandemic-related restrictions.

Employment in the Accommodation and food services sector began to increase in 2021 as pandemic-related restrictions eased. The growth continued through 2022 and 2023, with employment peaking in 2023 as the sector recovered; however, the number remained below the 2019 pre-pandemic level. Since 2023, this figure has decreased slightly.

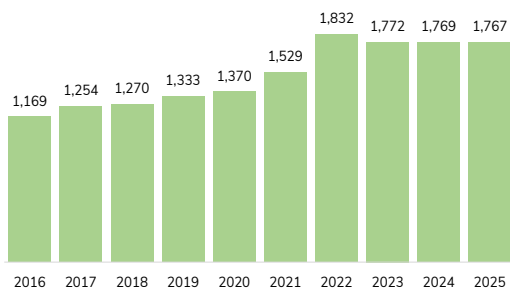
Yukon's 2025 average earnings (including overtime) in the Accommodation and food services sector (\$710.95) was the second-highest in Canada.

Compared to Canada (\$517.99), Yukon's 2025 average earnings (including overtime) in the Accommodation and food services sector (\$710.95) was \$192.96, or 37.3% higher.

Compared to the average earnings for Yukon's industrial aggregate (excluding unclassified businesses and including overtime), the average earnings in Yukon's Accommodation and food services sector was \$785.19, or 52.5% lower.

### Employment in Construction sector, Yukon, 2016 to 2025



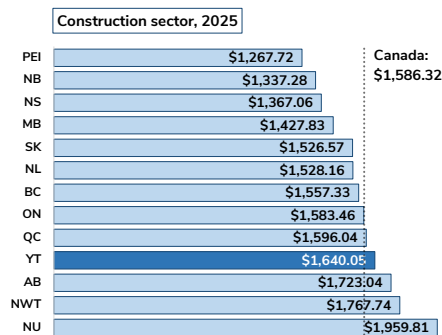

In 2025, the sixth-largest number of workers in Yukon were employed in the Construction sector (1,767 employees).

Employment in the Construction sector steadily increased between 2016 and 2020, followed by faster growth in 2021 and 2022, when it reached a peak of 1,832 employees. Since 2022, employment has declined slightly and has remained relatively stable ranging between 1,767 and 1,772.

Compared to 2016, the employment in the Construction sector has increased by 598, or 51.2%.

### Earnings for Construction sector, Canada, provinces and territories, 2025



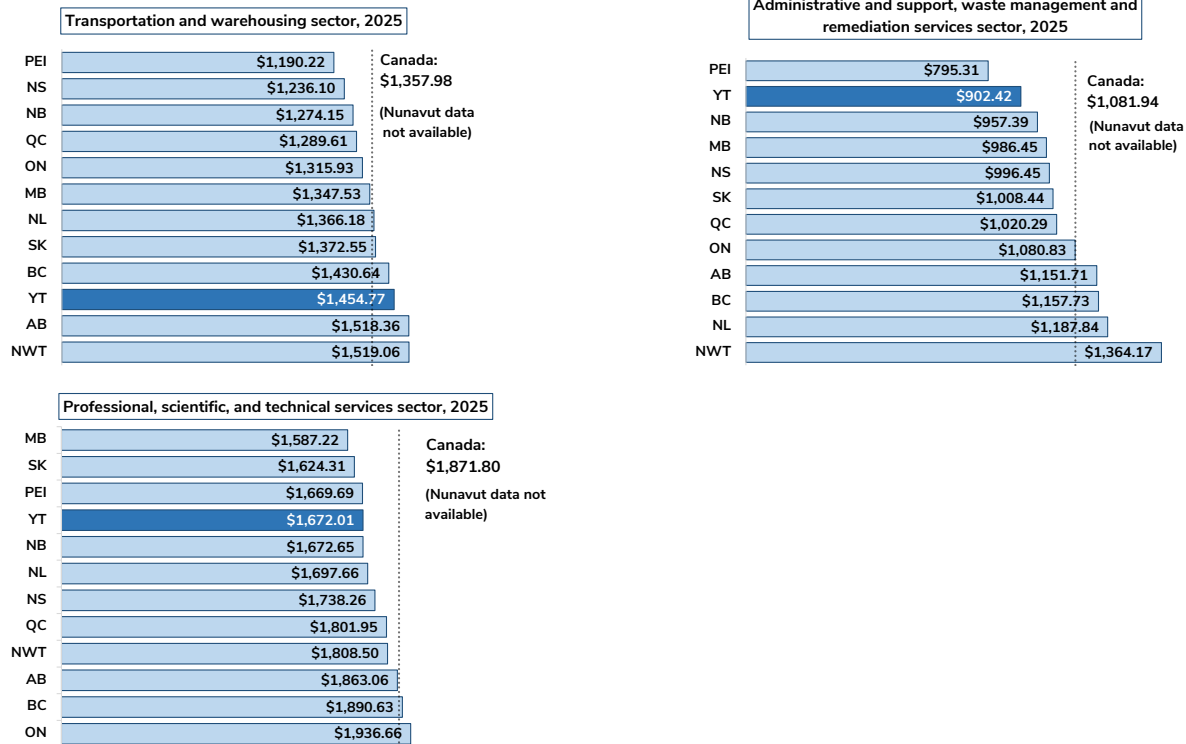

Yukon's 2025 average weekly earnings (including overtime) in the Construction sector (\$1,640.05) was the fourth-highest in Canada. Compared to the sector's national average earnings (\$1,586.32), Yukon's average was \$53.73, or 3.4% higher.

In 2025, Yukon's average weekly earnings in Construction (\$1,640.05) was \$319.76, or 16.3%, lower than Nunavut (\$1,959.81) and \$372.33, or 29.4%, higher than Prince Edward Island (\$1,267.72).

The average earnings in Construction was \$143.91, or 9.6%, higher than the average earnings for Yukon's industrial aggregate (excluding unclassified businesses and including overtime).

**Industrial aggregate** covers all industrial sectors except those primarily involved in agriculture, fishing and trapping, private household services, religious organizations and the military personnel of the defence services.

**Unclassified businesses** are businesses for which the industrial classification (NAICS 2022) has yet to be determined.

**Goods-producing industries** include the following industry sectors: Forestry, logging and support; Mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction; Utilities; Construction; and Manufacturing.

**Services-producing industries** include the following industry sectors: Trade (Wholesale trade and Retail trade); Transportation and warehousing; Information and cultural industries; Finance and insurance; Real estate and rental and leasing; Professional, scientific and technical services; Management of companies and enterprises; Administrative and support, waste management and remediation services; Educational services; Health care and social assistance; Arts, entertainment and recreation; Accommodation and food services; Other services (except public administration); and Public administration.

**Trade** includes Retail and Wholesale trade.

**Other services (except public administration)** includes: repair and maintenance; personal and laundry services; religious, grant-making, civic, and professional and similar organizations; and private households.
