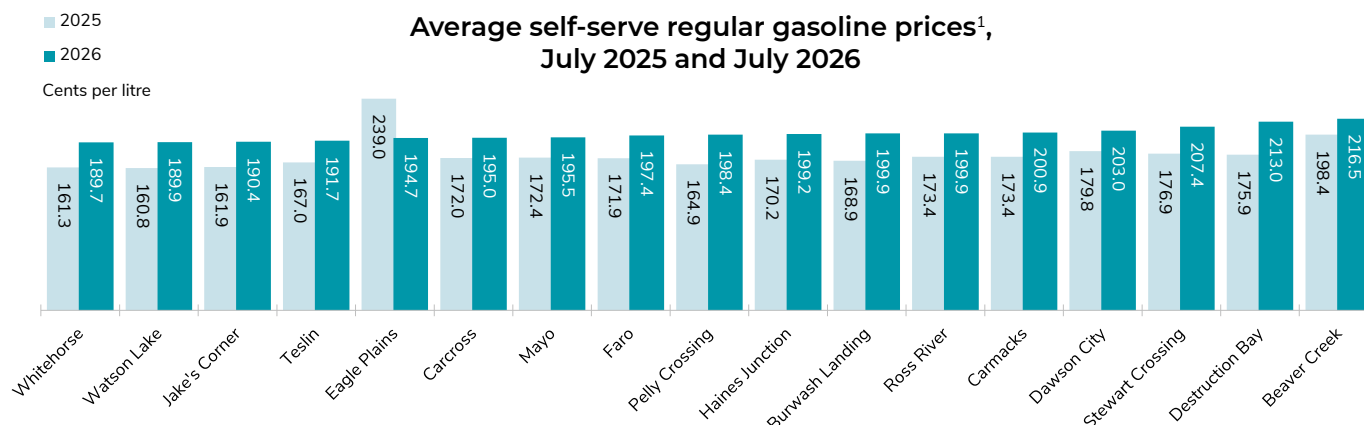

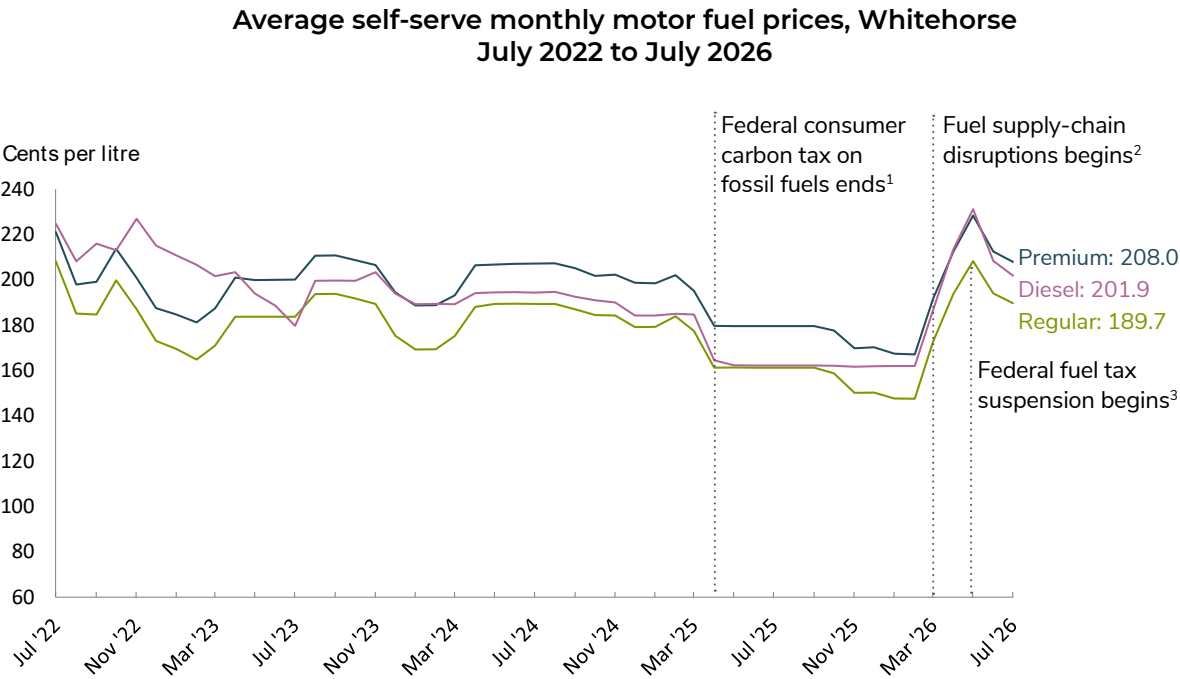
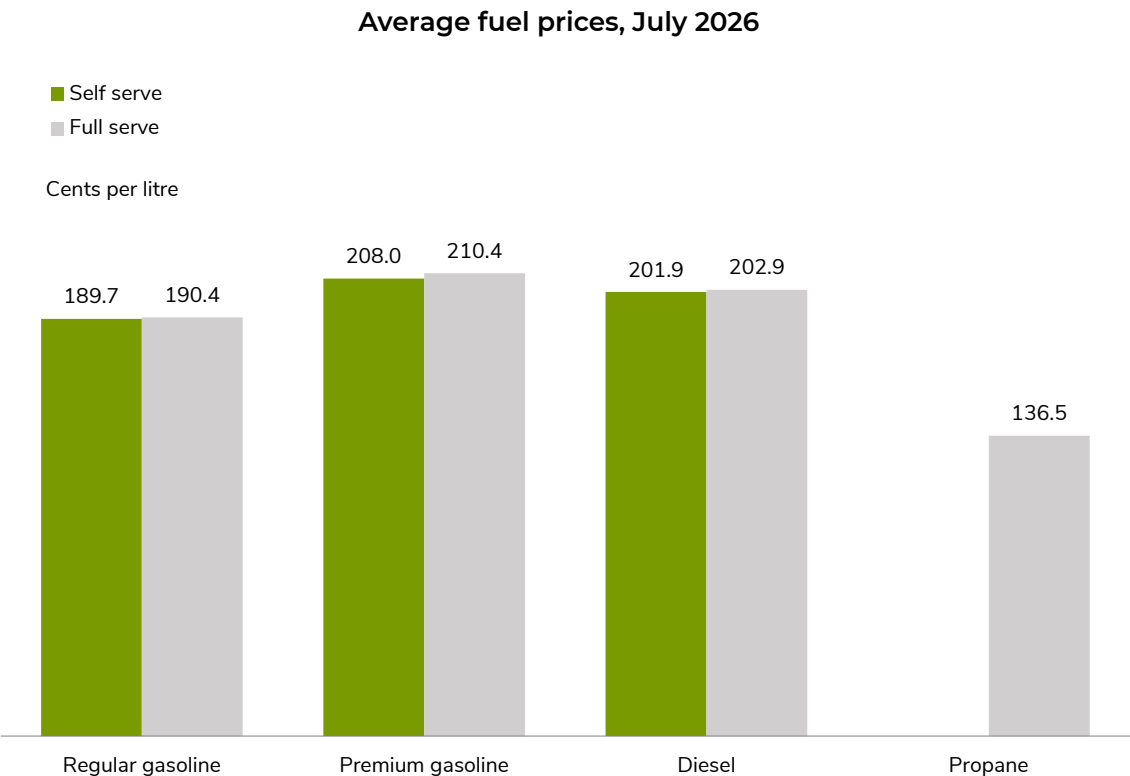
In July 2026, average **regular self-serve** gasoline prices¹ ranged from 189.7¢ per litre in Whitehorse to 216.5¢ per litre in Beaver Creek; a difference of 26.8¢. Comparing July 2026 to July 2025:

- **Regular self-serve** gasoline prices increased in all Yukon communities for which data are available with exception in Eagle Plains — the largest percentage increase was in Destruction Bay (21.1%).
- **Diesel self-serve** prices increased in all Yukon communities for which data are available — the largest percentage increase was in Haines Junction (25.7%).
- In communities offering **full-serve propane** fuel services, where data were available, prices increased in Whitehorse; decreased in Destruction Bay and Watson Lake; and remained the same in Dawson City, Eagle Plains and Teslin.



¹ Since early March 2026, crude oil prices have risen following supply chain disruptions in the Strait of Hormuz. This trend is evident in the month's survey data. On April 20, 2026, federal fuel excise tax rates on gasoline, diesel fuel, and aviation fuels were set to 0 cents per litre.

¹ In April 1, 2019, the Government of Canada levied a consumer carbon tax on fossil fuels, with rates varying by fuel type and increasing annually. From April 1, 2025, the carbon tax is no longer being levied as the applicable carbon tax rates for all types of fuel were set to zero.

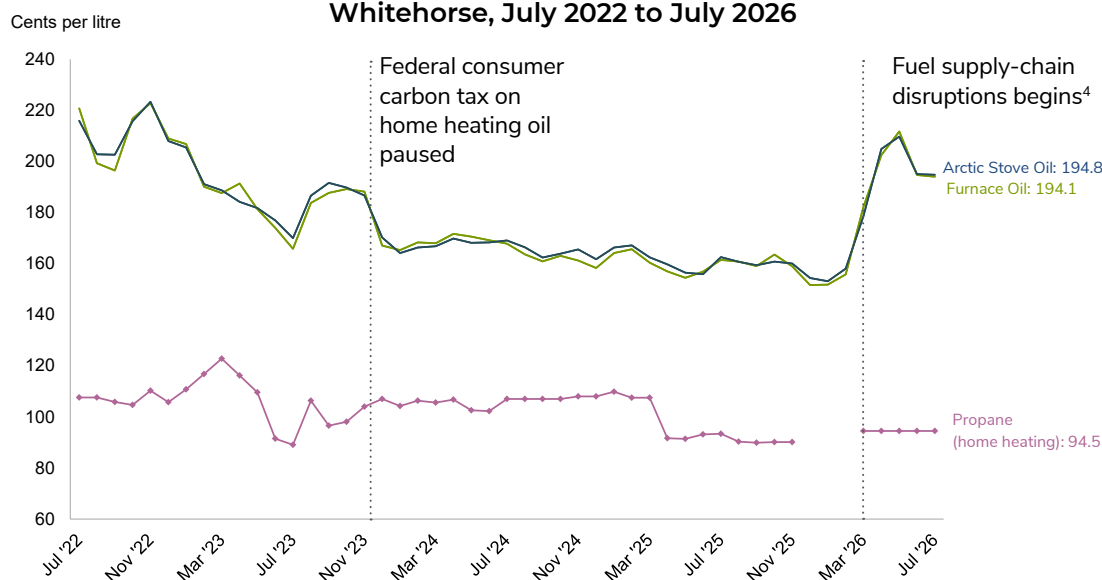

Comparing July 2026 to July 2025:

- **Furnace oil** prices increased in all Yukon communities — the largest percentage increase was in Ross River (28.7%);
- **Arctic stove oil** prices increased in all Yukon communities — the largest percentage increase was in Carmacks (28.2%); and
- **Propane (home heating)** prices increased by 1.2% in Whitehorse. Data were not available at the time of data collection for communities other than Whitehorse.

¹ Furnace oil is generally used for space heating and is exempt from federal fuel excise tax. It contains colourants to differentiate it from other similar types of fuel such as diesel.

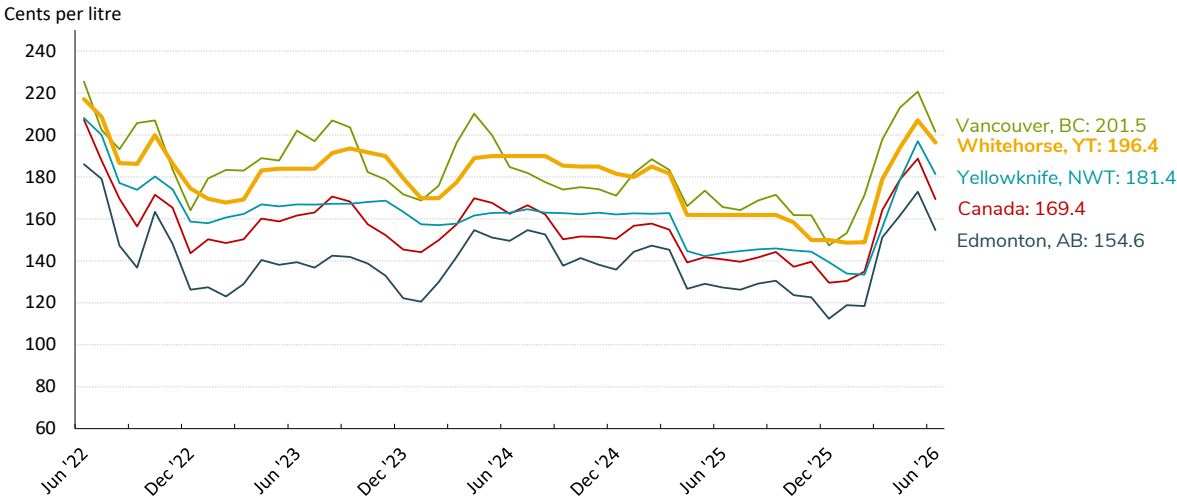
² Arctic stove oil is a type of furnace oil that contains colourants as well as anti-gel additives to prevent the oil from gelling at extreme cold temperatures (up to approximately -40°C).

³ Breaks in series indicate that data were not available for specific reporting periods.

⁴ Since early March 2026, crude oil prices have risen following supply chain disruptions in the Strait of Hormuz. This trend is evident in the month's survey data.

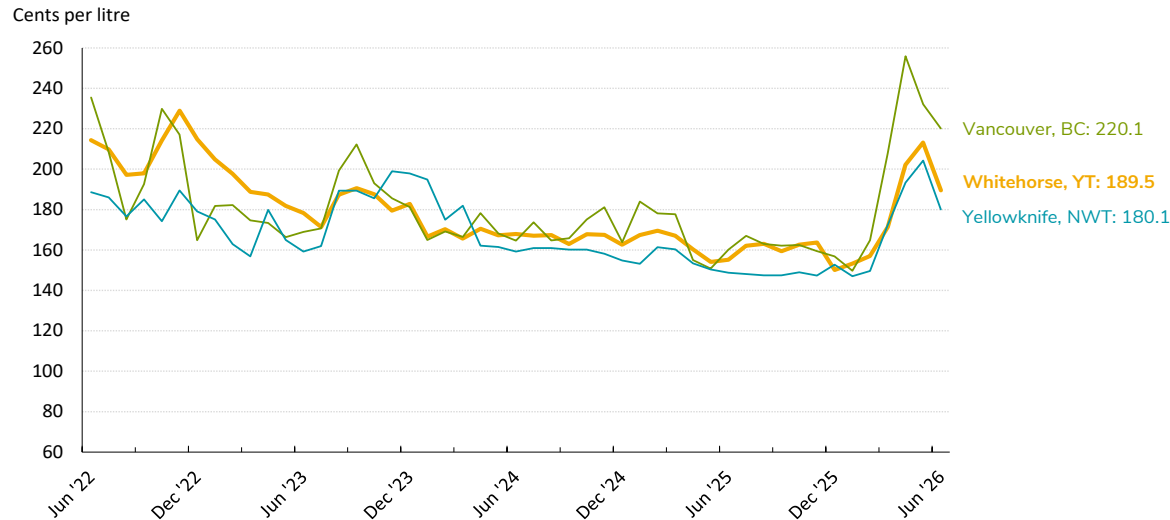
Monthly average retail prices for gasoline and fuel oil, by geography

Fuel prices in this publication are derived from the Yukon Fuel Price Survey, administered by Yukon Bureau of Statistics, and the latest available data from Statistics Canada. Fuel prices in rural and remote communities may undergo unusual price fluctuations. Therefore, monthly and annual comparisons of prices in these communities should be used with caution.
