Dear parents, guardians and students,

This letter is to inform you that Yukon Communicable Disease Control (YCDC) has been made aware of a **positive case of COVID-19 affecting the Route #33 School Bus on November 4th and 5th, with:**

- Afternoon pickup at Jack Hulland Elementary School and drop-off at Lobird, Granger, Arkell, Logan, Copper Ridge, Range Point, Kopper King

If you are unsure which bus route your child takes, please visit yukon.ca/en/school-bus-schedules

COVID-19 is a respiratory illness that is spread through droplets when a person coughs, speaks, or by touching surfaces contaminated by the virus with your hands and then touching your face before washing your hands.

You or your child may receive multiple exposure notices for different events. If you have received advice to self-isolate and also advice to self-monitor, then you should self-isolate. If you have received different dates for the duration of your self-isolation or self-monitoring, then use the latest date (longest duration).

Please talk to your children about their bus rides. Make sure they wear their mask for the whole ride and stay in their assigned seat to protect everyone's health.

A risk assessment has been completed by YCDC, in consultation with a Medical Officer of Health. After careful analysis, **we recommend that everyone who rode the Route #33 School Bus on the above date and time self-monitor for symptoms through November 19th.** It is very important that if any symptoms develop, no matter how mild, you do not go to work or school and you arrange for testing.

Please monitor for any of these signs/symptoms of COVID-19. They include:

Symptoms of COVID-19 may be mild or severe and often have a different presentation in persons who are very young or older persons. While most people will experience mild illness, older adults and people with pre-existing medical conditions are at higher risk for severe illness.

If you develop any symptoms, no matter how mild, contact the **COVID Testing and Assessment Centre (CTAC) in Whitehorse at 867-393-3083.** When calling CTAC, please mention that you are part of the Route #33 School Bus notifications.
