To Parents, Guardians, Students and Staff of Hummingbirds Preschool,

Yukon Communicable Disease Control (YCDC) has been made aware of a positive case of COVID-19 affecting:

- The Preschool Group on January 4th & January 5th, 2022
- The Toddler Group on January 5th, 2022

Staff and students connected to the above group on the above dates have been identified as close contacts of COVID-19. COVID-19 is a respiratory illness that is spread through droplets when a person coughs, speaks, or by touching surfaces contaminated by the virus with your hands and then touching your face before washing your hands.

A risk assessment has been completed by YCDC; after careful analysis the clinical care for staff and students connected to the above classes is:

If you are a staff/student in the **Preschool Group** or **Toddler Group**:

- self-isolate until January 12 inclusive, and self-monitor for symptoms through January 18, if:
 - not fully immunized against COVID-19 as described below or if you are immunized but have moderate to severe immunosuppression.
- self-monitor for symptoms through January 19, if:
 - If you are not moderately to severely immunosuppressed due to illness or medication, you'd need to have had:
 - **2 doses** of COVID-19 vaccine, with the second dose received within the last 6 months and at least 14 days before the contact; OR
 - **3 doses** of COVID-19 vaccine at least 14 days before the contact; OR
 - diagnosed with lab confirmed COVID-19 in the last 90 days.

It is very important that if any symptoms develop, no matter how mild, you do not go to work or school and follow current guidance on Yukon.ca.

Symptoms to self-monitor for include:
