To parents, guardians, students and staff,

Yukon Communicable Disease Control (YCDC) has been made aware of a positive case of COVID-19 at Porter Creek Secondary School affecting the:

- Period 3: Science for Citizens 11, on November 16th
- Period 4: Math Workplace 11, on November 16th

All staff and students who attended or worked in the above classes have been identified as close 'contacts' of COVID-19. YCDC has completed a careful risk assessment and the clinical care direction for students and staff attending or working in the above classes is:

- A. self-isolate until November 26 inclusive, and self-monitor for symptoms through November 30, if:
- contact is not fully immunized against COVID-19 (as described below in Section B).
- B. self-monitor for symptoms through November 30, if:
- contact is not significantly immunosuppressed due to illness or medication AND has received 2 doses of COVID-19 immunization, with the last dose prior to November 2.
OR
 - contact is significantly immunosuppressed due to illness or medication AND has received 3 doses of COVID-19 immunization, with the last dose prior to November 2.
OR
 - contact has been diagnosed with lab confirmed COVID-19 in the last 90 days.

It is very important that if any symptoms develop, no matter how mild, you do not go to work or school and arrange for testing. COVID-19 is a respiratory illness that is spread through droplets when a person coughs, speaks, or touches surfaces contaminated by the virus and then touches their face before washing their hands.

Symptoms to self-monitor for include:

Symptoms of COVID-19 may be mild or severe and often have a different presentation in persons who are very young or older persons. While most people will experience mild illness, older adults and people with pre-existing medical conditions are at higher risk for severe illness.
