To parents, guardians, students and staff of Selkirk Elementary School,

Yukon Communicable Disease Control (YCDC) has been made aware of a positive case of COVID-19 at Selkirk Elementary School affecting the:

- 4/5 M Split class (English Stream), on January 7th, 2022

All staff and students who attended or worked in the above classes have been identified as close 'contacts' of COVID-19. YCDC has completed a careful risk assessment and the clinical care direction for students and staff attending or working in the above class is:

A. self-isolate until January 14th inclusive, and self-monitor for symptoms through January 21st, if:

- contact is not fully immunized against COVID-19 (as described below in Section B).

B. self-monitor for symptoms through January 21st, if:

- contact is not significantly immunosuppressed due to illness or medication AND has received 2 doses of COVID-19 immunization, with the second dose received within the last 6 months and at least 14 days before the contact.

OR

- contact is significantly immunosuppressed due to illness or medication AND has received 3 doses of COVID-19 immunization, with the last dose received at least 14 days prior to the contact.

OR

- contact has been diagnosed with lab confirmed COVID-19 in the last 90 days.

It is very important that if any symptoms develop, no matter how mild, you do not go to work or school and follow the current guidance on Yukon.ca. COVID-19 is a respiratory illness that is spread through droplets when a person coughs, speaks, or touches surfaces contaminated by the virus and then touches their face before washing their hands.

Symptoms to self-monitor for include:

Symptoms of COVID-19 may be mild or severe and often have a different presentation in persons who are very young or older persons. While most people will experience mild illness, older adults and people with pre-existing medical conditions are at higher risk for severe illness.
