FONDS DESCRIPTION

Clara Tizya fonds. – 1923-1997

Provenance

Tizya, Clara, 1913-1998

Biographical Description

Clara Linklater Tizya was born July 15, 1913 at Rampart House, Yukon to Archie Linklater and Katherine Netro. Her father was of Scottish descent from the Orkney Islands, and her mother was Ninsyag and Vuntut Gwitchin. She grew up nomadically between Rampart House, Dawson City and Old Crow in the Yukon, and Fort Yukon in Alaska – wherever life's demands took her family.

Clara married Peter Tizya, son of John Tizya and Sarah Moses in 1930 at St. Luke's Church in Old Crow. Together they lived a traditional lifestyle and raised, over a span of 40 years, 13 children: Katherine, Lena, Helen, Mildred, Archie, Ethel, Trudy, Douglas, Lula-Belle, Rosalee, Charles, Stewart and Lulu Belle.

The Tizyas left Old Crow in 1946 to accommodate their children's education and made their home between Carcross and Whitehorse. Clara left the Yukon in 1966 to begin a new life in Vancouver, B.C. After 30 years of city life she returned and bought herself a little corner of the Yukon in Tagish and began commuting between her families in the Yukon and Vancouver.

Clara had a passion for reading, writing and traveling and she had a devotion to the church. She was also a proud grandmother to 29 grandchildren and 15 great grandchildren. Clara Tizya died in Whitehorse, Yukon August 16, 1998.

Scope and Content

These records provide a fascinating view of a woman who divided her life between living a traditional lifestyle in small isolated northern communities and a modern lifestyle in Vancouver, B.C. The fonds are organized into four series: Photographs, Textual Records, Imprint and Miscellaneous.

The Photographs, three albums with black and white and colour prints, were taken over a span of 60 years, and depict people and scenes in the Yukon, and outside the territory. The photographs, many with captions, capture Clara's extended family and many friends as well as specific places and events.

The Textual Records series is divided into 6 sub-series: Diaries, Clippings, Church, Conferences, First Nations, and Personal Papers. Forty-three diaries, written from 1979 to 1997, are a record of Clara's daily activities, travels, and experiences. The remaining sub-series are materials relating to the Anglican Church, First Nations of the Yukon and Canada, her attendance at conferences, personal correspondence and private papers.

The Imprint series covers a variety of topics: the Anglican Church, missionaries in the Arctic, the Carcross Residential School [Chooutla School], Vancouver Yukoners' Association, funeral

liturgies and obituaries, bus and airline schedules, and the Northern Lights newsletter. The Miscellaneous series includes 4 audio discs and one artifact.

Source of Title

The title is based on provenance.

Physical Description Note

Includes 459 photographs, 1 m of textual records, imprints, 4 audio discs, and 1 artifact.

Arrangement

The original order of the photographs within albums was maintained. The majority of textual records were not in any discernable order and were arranged by the archivist according to subject and filed alphabetically. The diaries in Acc.# 97/58 were integrated with Acc.# 99/66R so that the diaries could be arranged into chronological order. Only Acc.# 99/66R is used as a locator on the folders.

Immediate source of acquisition

Clara Tizya donated the fonds to the Yukon Archives in 1995, 1996 and 1997.

Restrictions apply to several files and these are indicated in the file listing. There are no donor-imposed restrictions on the remaining material. General copyright or institutional or legal restrictions may apply.

The series consists of textual records divided into 6 sub-series. Sub-series 2.1 Diaries, contains 43 diaries written by Clara Tizya. They document her daily activities while living in Vancouver and the Yukon as well as places she travelled for personal interest or while attending conferences. Clara writes about visiting many friends and family, her frequent road trips to and from the Yukon, trips to Old Crow and Rampart House, her activities with the Church, interest in the Royal family, and periodically voices concerns about her family and money problems. Sub-series 2.2 Clippings, are from Yukon and Vancouver newspapers and cover a variety of topics related to First Nations in the Yukon and Canada, members of the Tizya family, and her daughter Lena's trip to the Coronation. Sub-series 2.3 Church, contains a variety of documents relating to the Anglican Church, the majority of the material relates to Christ Church Cathedral in Whitehorse and includes correspondence, articles and the Bishop's Assembly in Old Crow. Sub-series 2.4 Conferences, contains material relating to 3 conferences attended by Clara - Women in Interfaith Dialogue, National Native Convocation and the World Council of Churches Consultation on Native Spirituality. Sub-series 2.5 First Nations, contains newspapers published by First Nations in Canada, newsletters from the Fort St. John Friendship Society, and documents from organizations including the Council of Native Ministries, the National Indian Council and the United Native Nations. Sub-series 2.6 Personal Papers, contains a variety of material including correspondence to Clara from friends and family, her family tree, personal financial documents, and membership in the Vancouver Yukoners' Association.
