

## Investment in Building Construction, October 2019

Released by Statistics Canada — December 23, 2019

The estimated investment (seasonally adjusted) in building construction in Yukon for October 2019 was \$30.4 million, an increase of \$8.6 million, or 39.3%, compared to the figure for October 2018. Compared to the figure for September 2019, the October 2019 investment in building construction in Yukon increased by \$4.3 million, or 16.5%.

Nationally, investment in building construction (seasonally adjusted) in October 2019 increased 6.4% compared to the figure for October 2018, and decreased 0.5% compared to the figure for September 2019.

On a **year-to-date** basis from January through October of 2019, the total value of investment in building construction in Yukon was \$244.4 million. This represents a decrease of \$6.4 million, or 2.6%, compared to the same time period in 2018 (\$250.8 million); residential investment was down \$29.6 million and non-residential investment was up \$23.2 million.
