

Consumer Price Index, April 2023

Released by Statistics Canada – May 16, 2023

Comparing April 2023 to April 2022, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 5.8% in Whitehorse (data are not available for Yukon). Whitehorse's year-over-year CPI change for the month of April 2023 was 1.4 percentage points higher than that for Canada (4.4%).

The main contributors to the year-over-year increase in Whitehorse CPI for the month of April 2023 were mortgage interest cost, traveller accommodation, and rent. Some of these increases were offset by price decreases in childcare and housekeeping services, fuel oil and other fuels, and video and audio subscription services.

On a monthly basis, the CPI in Whitehorse increased by 0.9% in April 2023 compared to March 2023; while nationally, the CPI increased by 0.7%.
