

## Consumer Price Index, August 2022

Released by Statistics Canada – September 20, 2022

Comparing August 2022 to August 2021, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 7.6% in Whitehorse (data are not available for Yukon). Whitehorse's year-over-year CPI change for the month of August 2022 was 0.6 percentage points higher than that for Canada (7.0%).

The main contributors to the year-over-year increase in Whitehorse CPI for the month of August 2022 were traveller accommodation, fuel oil and other fuels, and gasoline. Some of these increases were offset by price decreases in telephone services and internet access services.

On a monthly basis, the CPI in Whitehorse increased 0.3% in August 2022 compared to July 2022; nationally, the CPI decreased 0.3%.
