

Consumer Price Index, January 2023

Released by Statistics Canada – February 21, 2023

Comparing January 2023 to January 2022, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 7.9% in Whitehorse (data are not available for Yukon). Whitehorse's year-over-year CPI change for the month of January 2023 was 2.0 percentage points higher than that for Canada (5.9%).

The main contributors to the year-over-year increase in Whitehorse CPI for the month of January 2023 were fuel oil and other fuels; mortgage interest cost; and traveller accommodation. Some of these increases were offset by price decreases in telephone services; internet access services; and fresh or frozen beef.

On a monthly basis, the CPI in Whitehorse increased by 0.1% in January 2023 compared to December 2022; while nationally, the CPI increased by 0.5%.
