

Consumer Price Index, July 2024

Released by Statistics Canada – August 20, 2024

Comparing July 2024 to July 2023, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 1.4% in Whitehorse (data are not available for Yukon). Whitehorse's year-over-year CPI change for the month of July 2024 (1.4%) was 1.1 percentage point lower than that for Canada (2.5%).

The main contributors to the year-over-year increase in Whitehorse CPI for the month of July 2024 were mortgage interest cost; food purchased from restaurants; and rent. Some of these increases were offset by price decreases in traveller accommodation; telephone services; and home entertainment equipment, parts and services.

On a monthly basis, the CPI in Whitehorse increased by 0.8% in July 2024 compared to June 2024; while nationally, the CPI increased by 0.4%.
