

Consumer Price Index, June 2023

Released by Statistics Canada – July 18, 2023

Comparing June 2023 to June 2022, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 4.8% in Whitehorse (data are not available for Yukon). Whitehorse's year-over-year CPI change for the month of June 2023 was 2.0 percentage points higher than that for Canada (2.8%).

The main contributors to the year-over-year increase in Whitehorse CPI for the month of June 2023 were mortgage interest cost, traveller accommodation, and rent. Some of these increases were offset by price decreases in gasoline, telephone services, and fuel oil and other fuels.

On a monthly basis, the CPI in Whitehorse increased by 1.0% in June 2023 compared to May 2023; while nationally, the CPI increased by 0.1%.
