

Consumer Price Index, October 2022

Released by Statistics Canada – November 16, 2022

Comparing October 2022 to October 2021, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 7.6% in Whitehorse (data are not available for Yukon). Whitehorse's year-over-year CPI change for the month of October 2022 was 0.7 percentage points higher than that for Canada (6.9%).

The main contributors to the year-over-year increase in Whitehorse CPI for the month of October 2022 were fuel oil and other fuels, traveller accommodation, and gasoline. Some of these increases were offset by price decreases in telephone services; home entertainment equipment, parts and services; and internet access services.

On a monthly basis, the CPI in Whitehorse increased by 0.5% in October 2022 compared to September 2022; while nationally, the CPI increased by 0.7%.
