

Consumer Price Index, September 2024

Released by Statistics Canada – October 15, 2024

Comparing September 2024 to September 2023, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 1.8% in Whitehorse (data are not available for Yukon). Whitehorse's year-over-year CPI change for the month of September 2024 (1.8%) was 0.2 percentage points higher than that for Canada (1.6%).

The main contributors to the year-over-year increase in Whitehorse CPI for the month of September 2024 were mortgage interest cost; food purchased from restaurants; and rent. Some of these increases were offset by price decreases in traveller accommodation; fuel oil and other fuels; and inter-city transportation.

On a monthly basis, the CPI in Whitehorse decreased by 0.3% in September 2024 compared to August 2024; nationally, the CPI decreased by 0.4%.
