



Employment Insurance, July 2024 (preliminary)

Released by Statistics Canada – September 19, 2024

In July 2024, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) receiving regular income support benefits¹ in Yukon was 620; of which, 400 were males and 220 were females. The total number of beneficiaries in July 2024 increased by 10, or 1.6%, from the July 2023 figure and increased by 30, or 5.1%, compared to the June 2024 preliminary figure.

Nationally, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) in July 2024 increased by 10.0% compared to July 2023 and increased by 2.2% from the June 2024 preliminary figure.

Notes to Readers:

- With the July 18, 2024, release of May data, the seasonally adjusted series of Employment Insurance statistics were revised back to January 2000 to reflect the most recent seasonal factors as well as the 2021 Standard Geographical Classification (SGC). Also, data for Employment Insurance (EI) beneficiaries by occupation conforming to the 2021 National Occupational Classification are available from January 2008 onwards.
- The number of beneficiaries is a measure of all people who received regular EI benefits from July 14 to 20, 2024. This period coincides with the reference week of the LFS.
- The number of beneficiaries represents a count of persons who qualified for employment insurance benefits during the Labour Force Survey reference week, usually containing the 15th day of the month.
- Figures are rounded to the nearest 10.

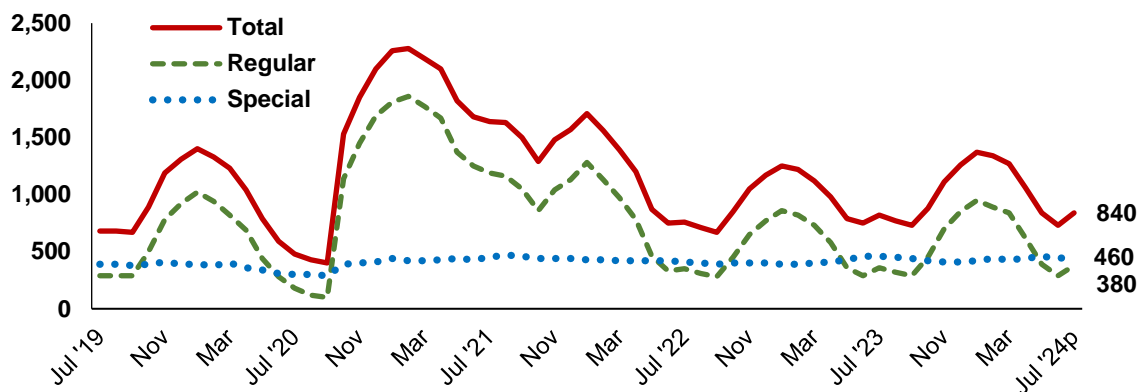

Special benefit recipients include people receiving sickness, maternity, parental, and compassionate care benefits.
