



Employment Insurance, June 2024 (preliminary)

Released by Statistics Canada – August 22, 2024

In June 2024, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) receiving regular income support benefits¹ in Yukon was 570; of which, 360 were males and 210 were females. The total number of beneficiaries in June 2024 remained unchanged from the June 2023 figure and the May 2024 preliminary figure.

Nationally, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) in June 2024 increased by 10.4% compared to June 2023 and increased by 1.3% from the May 2024 preliminary figure.

Notes to Readers:

- With the July 18, 2024, release of May data, the seasonally adjusted series of Employment Insurance statistics were revised back to January 2000 to reflect the most recent seasonal factors as well as the 2021 Standard Geographical Classification (SGC). Also, data for Employment Insurance (EI) beneficiaries by occupation conforming to the 2021 National Occupational Classification are available from January 2008 onwards.
- The number of beneficiaries is a measure of all people who received regular EI benefits from June 9 to 15, 2024. This period coincides with the reference week of the LFS.
- The number of beneficiaries represents a count of persons who qualified for employment insurance benefits during the Labour Force Survey reference week, usually containing the 15th day of the month.
- Figures are rounded to the nearest 10.

Canada, Provinces and Territories (seasonally adjusted)**

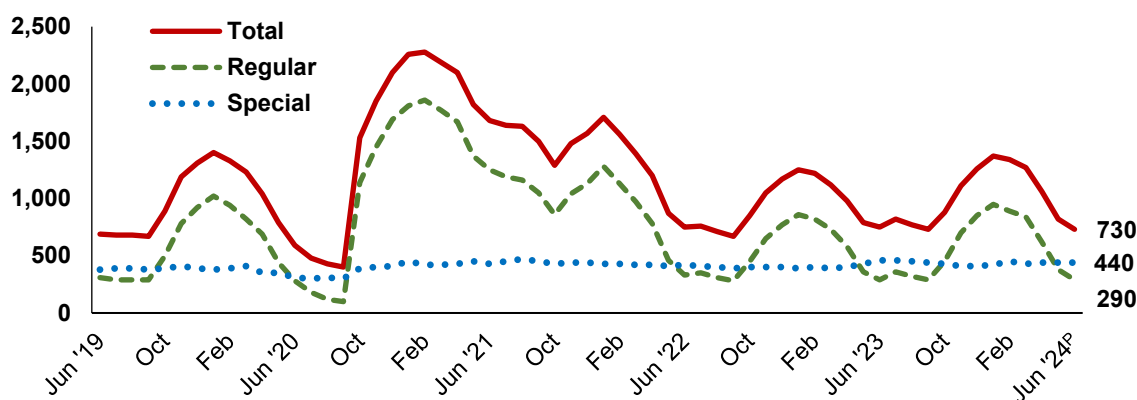

Special benefit recipients include people receiving sickness, maternity, parental, and compassionate care benefits.
