



Employment Insurance, November 2022 (preliminary)

Released by Statistics Canada – January 20, 2023

In November 2022, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) receiving regular income support benefits¹ in Yukon was 530; of which 360 were males and 170 were females. Compared to November 2021, the total number of beneficiaries decreased by 380, or 41.8%; compared to the October 2022 preliminary figure, the total number of beneficiaries decreased by 30, or 5.4%.

Nationally, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) in November 2022 decreased by 44.1% compared to November 2021 and decreased by 5.4% compared to the October 2022 preliminary figure.

Notes to Readers:

- No methodological changes were made to the Employment Insurance Statistics (EIS) program over the COVID-19 period. EIS reflect the Employment Insurance (EI) program for the Labour Force Survey (LFS) reference week in each month.
- The number of beneficiaries is a measure of all people who received regular EI benefits from November 6 to 12, 2022. This period coincides with the reference week of the LFS.
