



Employment Insurance, September 2022 (preliminary data)

Released by Statistics Canada – November 17, 2022

In September 2022, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) receiving regular income support benefits¹ in Yukon was 640; of which 420 were males and 220 were females. Compared to September 2021, the total number of beneficiaries decreased by 760, or 54.3%; compared to the August 2022 preliminary figure, the total number of beneficiaries decreased by 10, or 1.5%.

Nationally, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) in September 2022 decreased by 65.0% compared to September 2021 and decreased by 5.6% compared to the August 2022 preliminary figure.

Notes to Readers:

- No methodological changes were made to the Employment Insurance Statistics (EIS) program over the COVID-19 period. EIS reflect the Employment Insurance (EI) program for the Labour Force Survey (LFS) reference week in each month.
- The number of beneficiaries is a measure of all people who received regular EI benefits from September 11 to 17, 2022. This period coincides with the reference week of the LFS.
