



Gross Domestic Product by Industry (GDP), 2021

Released by Statistics Canada – November 8, 2022

Yukon's real GDP by industry (\$2,933.0 million, in chained 2012 dollars, at basic prices¹) increased by \$265.6 million, or 10.0%, in 2021. This followed a revised GDP growth of 3.7% in 2020.

In 2021, GDP by industry increased in all provinces and territories except Saskatchewan — growth ranged from -0.7% in Saskatchewan to 10.0% in Yukon.

Yukon's GDP growth in 2021 was primarily driven by Goods-producing industries which grew by 25.4%. Among the Goods-producing industry sectors, GDP from Mining grew 34.4%, followed by Construction (19.0%), and Utilities (4.2%).

Yukon's Services-producing industries grew 4.9% in 2021. Among the Services-producing industry sectors, Wholesale Trade grew by 19.9%, followed by Accommodation and food services (13.5%), Health care and social assistance (11.5%), and Arts, entertainment and recreation (11.0%).
