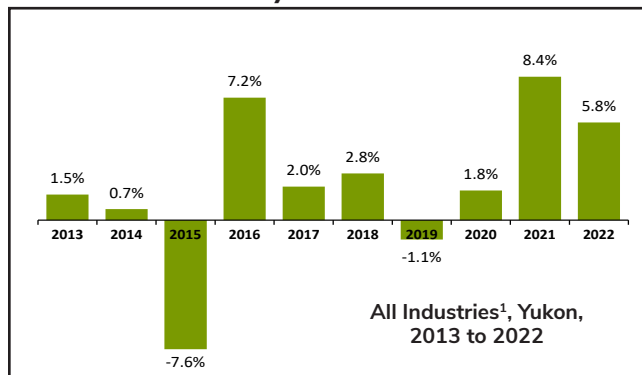
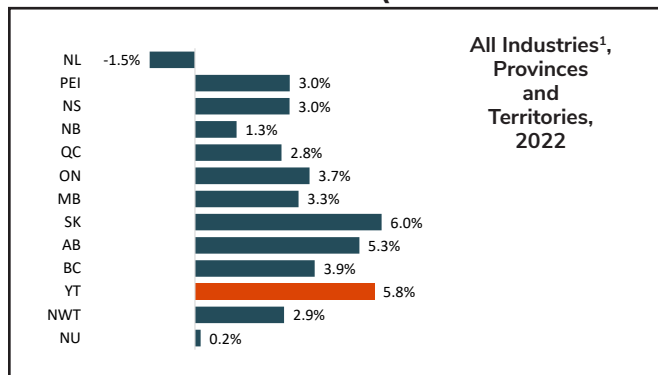
Highlights:

- Yukon's real GDP by industry (at basic prices) in 2022 was \$3,297.6 million (in chained 2017 dollars), an increase of \$179.7 million, or 5.8%, from the revised 2021 figure (\$3,117.9 million).
- In 2022, the largest dollar-amount gain was in the Construction sector, with an increase of \$94.5 million, up 34.0% from 2021 (revised).

The GDP of an industry represents the value added by labour and capital in transforming inputs purchased from other industries into output. This analytical report presents Statistics Canada's latest estimates of Yukon's real GDP by industry at basic prices in chained (2017) dollars. Recent figures are subject to revision.

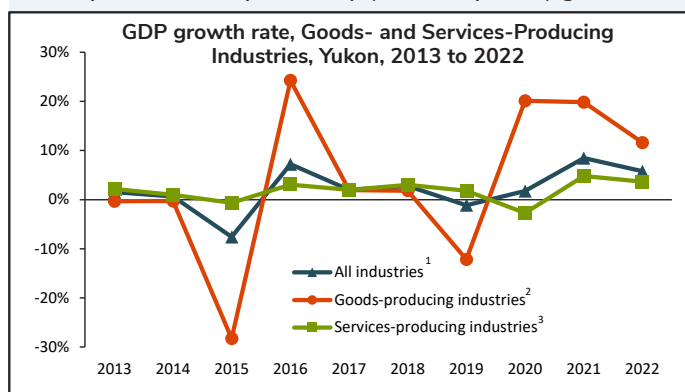
GDP is one of the primary economic indicators used by decision-makers within government, financial and other institutions to evaluate the health of the economy. A large growth in real GDP is interpreted as a sign that the economy is doing well, while a small or negative growth indicates poor economic performances.

Note: The current calculation of GDP is based on the input-output structure of the economy in 2021 (benchmark year). Substantial revisions in subsequent years can occur due to updated benchmark year. Please see endnote 2 on page 8.

Over the 10-year period from 2013 to 2022, the growth rate of Yukon's GDP by industry (at basic prices) varied from a low of -7.6% in 2015 to a high of 8.4% in 2021. Yukon's GDP by industry (at basic prices) growth rate declined from 2013 (1.5%) to 2014 (0.7%) before shrinking in 2015 (-7.6%). In 2016, the growth rate rebounded to 7.2% before slowing down to 2.0% in 2017 and 2.8% in 2018, and then shrinking in 2019 (-1.1%). In the past three years, GDP by industry (at basic prices) grew at a rate of 1.8% in 2020, 8.4% in 2021 and 5.8% in 2022.



In 2022, Yukon's GDP in the Goods-producing industries² increased by 11.6%, while the GDP of Yukon's Services-producing industries³ increased by 3.6%.

Between 2013 and 2022, the GDP growth rate for the Goods-producing industries² fluctuated considerably (from -28.3% in 2015 to 24.2% in 2016) due mainly to activities in the Mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction, and the Construction sectors. Comparatively, the GDP growth rate for the Services-producing industries³ fluctuated within a relatively narrow margin (from -2.7% in 2020 to 4.8% in 2021) over the same period.

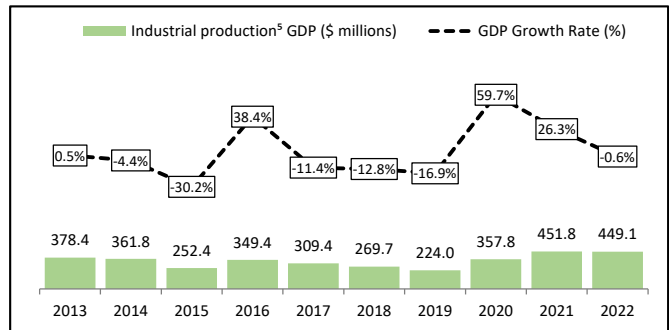
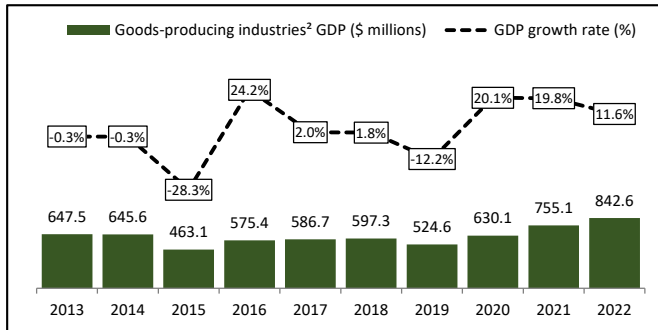

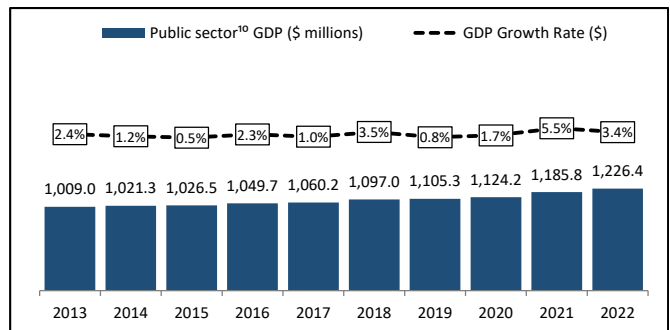
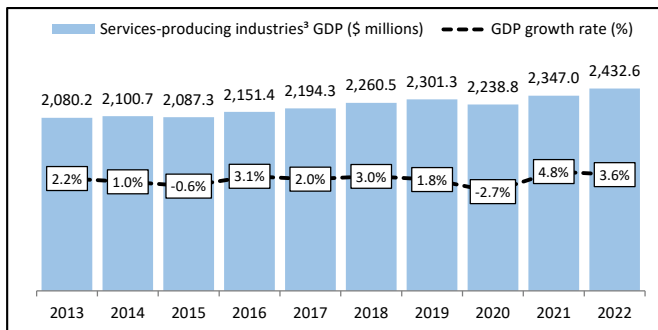

During the period from 2013 to 2022, as a proportion of total GDP, the Goods-producing sector ranged from a low of 18.2% in 2015 to a high of 25.7% in 2022.

From 2013 to 2022, Industrial production, which is primarily a subset of the Goods-producing sector was equal to, on average, 49.1% of total GDP from the Goods-producing sector.



During the period from 2013 to 2022, as a proportion of total GDP:

- The Services-producing sector ranged from a low of 74.3% in 2022 to a high of 81.8% in 2015; and
- The Public sector, which is a subset of the Services-producing sector, ranged from a low of 37.0% in 2013 to a high of 40.2% in 2015.

From 2013 to 2022, the Public sector GDP contribution, on average, accounted for 49.1% of total GDP from Services-producing industries.

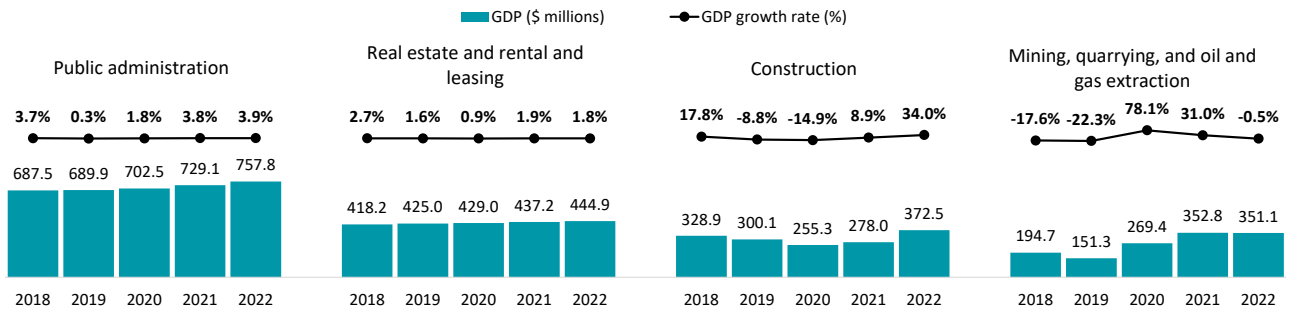

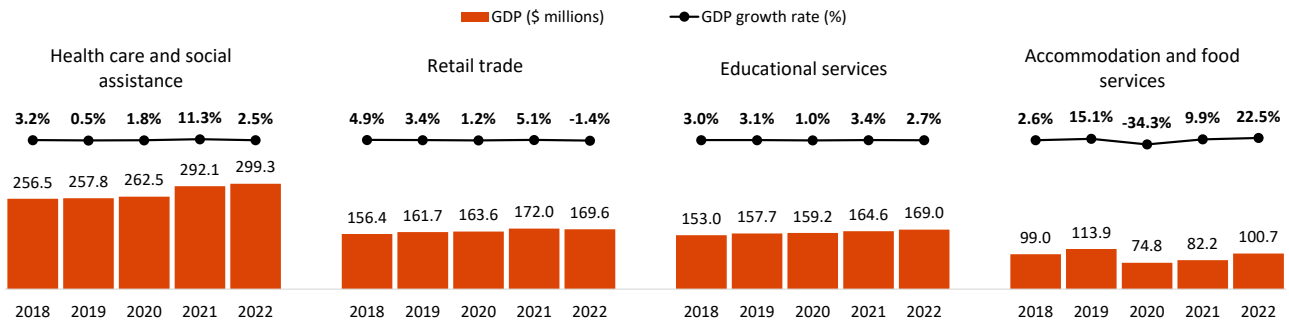

GDP Output and growth rate, by NAICS, Yukon, 2018 to 2022 (based on chained 2017 dollars)

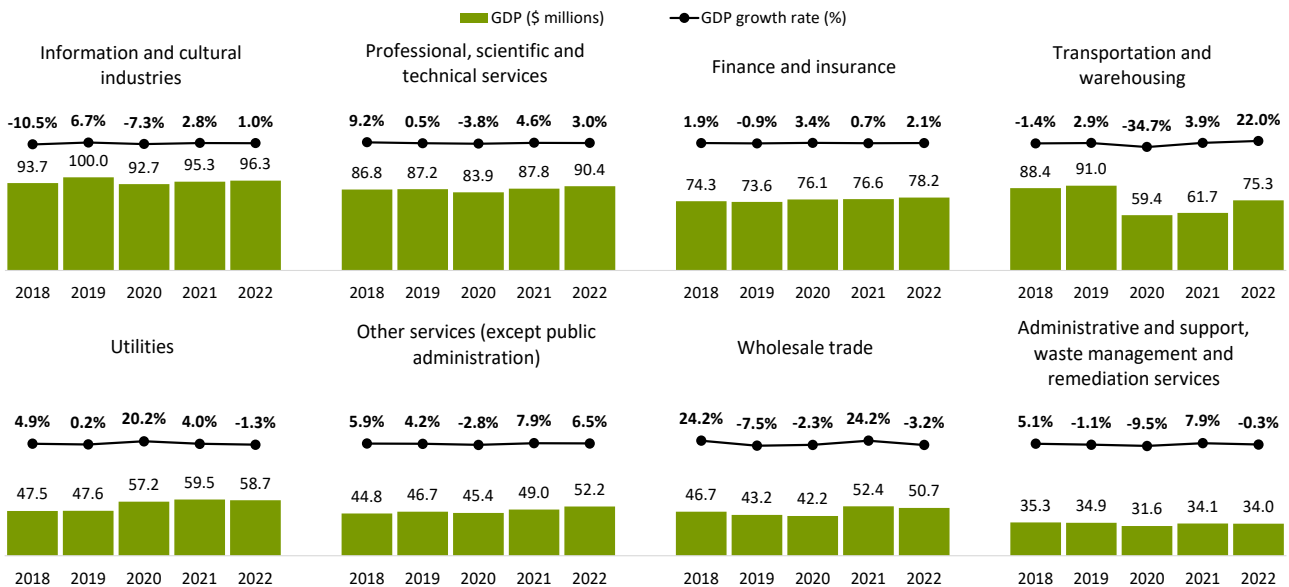
Sectors with GDP more than \$300 million, 2018 to 2022



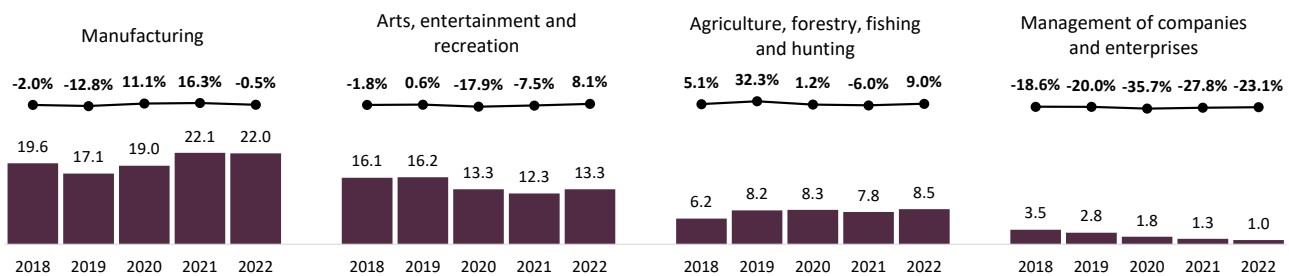
Sectors with GDP of \$100 million or more but less than \$300 million, 2018 to 2022

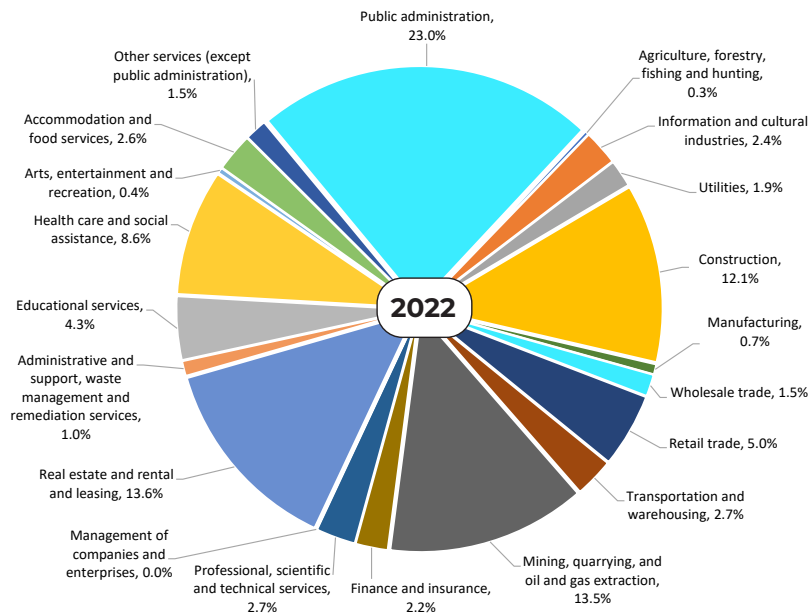

Major contributors to Yukon GDP by industry in 2022 were:

- Public administration (23.0%);
- Real estate and rental and leasing (13.6%);
- Mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction (13.5%);
- Construction (12.1%);
- Health care and social assistance (8.6%); and
- Retail trade (5.0%).

The contribution of each of the remaining industries was less than 5.0%.

Endnotes:

¹ Statistics Canada uses the chain Fisher volume index method of calculating the real GDP. This method was adopted as it produces the most accurate measure of growth in GDP and its components, and the change brings the Canadian measure in line with the US quarterly Income and Product Accounts which also use the chain Fisher formula to measure real GDP.

An important consequence of using chain indexes is that the associated volume measures are not additive. That is, the sum of the chained values for each component of an aggregate does not equal the chained value of the aggregate. For example, the sum of the components of the *Transportation & Warehousing Industry* is not equal to the number given for that industry, just as the sum of the individual industry sectors is not equal to the number given for *All Industries*.

² The most recent benchmark year for which the input-output structure of Yukon's economy is measured is 2019 and therefore it is the most current year for which the contributions of different industries to GDP may be accurately measured. GDP calculations for subsequent years are projections based on the structure of Yukon's economy in 2019 and changes in prices and output volumes in intervening years. Substantial revisions to these estimates can occur if there are major changes to the structure of the economy; for example, the opening or closing of a large mine after the most recent input/output accounts reference year.
