



Non-Permanent Residents, Q2 2024

Released by Statistics Canada – June 19, 2024

According to estimates by Statistics Canada, as of April 1, 2024, there were 1,688 non-permanent residents living in Yukon. This represents an increase of 463, or 37.8%, compared to April 1, 2023. Nationally, the non-permanent resident population increased by 42.1% during the same period.

As of April 1, 2024, non-permanent residents accounted for 3.7% of Yukon's total population, an increase of 1.0 percentage point compared to April 1, 2023. Nationally, the proportion of the total population that were non-permanent residents increased by 1.9 percentage points during the same period.

Notes:

1. Non-permanent resident refers to a person from another country with a usual place of residence in Canada and who has a work or study permit, or who has claimed refugee status (asylum claimants, protected persons and related groups). Family members living with work or study permit holders are also included unless these family members are already Canadian citizens, landed immigrants (permanent residents), or non-permanent residents themselves. In Statistics Canada's Demographic Estimates Program, the terms non-permanent resident and temporary immigrant are used interchangeably. Caution should be used when comparing data related to non-permanent residents from the Statistics Canada's Demographic Estimates Program and data on temporary residents from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) since these populations are not fully comparable.
2. Population figures are based on estimates by Statistics Canada. These figures may differ from Yukon Bureau of Statistics population estimates due to methodological differences.
