



## Gross Domestic Product by Industry (GDP), 2020 (preliminary estimates)

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Preliminary estimates of Statistics Canada show that Yukon's real GDP by Industry in 2020 totalled \$2,678.9 million, an increase of 1.1%, following an increase of 0.7% in 2019.

In 2020, GDP by Industry decreased in all provinces and territories, with the exceptions of Nunavut (3.5%) and Yukon (1.1%). Northwest Territories had the largest decrease at -10.4%.

In Yukon, GDP in *Goods-producing industries* increased by \$135.2 million, or 25.7%, while GDP in *Services-producing industries* declined by \$112.3 million, or 5.3%.

GDP in *Mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction* sector increased 107.3% due to a \$107.3 million, or 121.9%, increase in *Gold and silver ore mining*; a \$20.2 million, or 325.8% increase in *Copper, nickel, lead and zinc ore mining*; as well as a \$33.7 million, or 67.0%, increase in *Support activities for mining*.

Other sectors of the economy that had an increase in GDP in 2020 included: *Utilities* (\$6.4 million, or 12.8%), *Manufacturing* (\$2.9 million, or 15.0%), *Retail trade* (\$2.4 million, or 1.7%), *Finance and insurance* (\$4.1 million, or 5.3%), and *Real estate and rental and leasing* (\$2.9 million, or 0.7%).

The remaining sectors of the economy declined in 2020. They include: *Agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting* (-4.2%); *Construction* (-7.1%); *Wholesale trade* (-10.8%); *Transportation and warehousing* (-40.6%); *Information and cultural industries* (-0.9%); *Professional, scientific and technical services* (-2.7%); *Management of companies and enterprises* (-12.9%); *Administrative and support, waste management and remediation services* (-15.6%); *Educational services* (-4.4%); *Health care and social assistance* (-4.9%); *Arts, entertainment and recreation* (-35.2%); *Accommodation and food services* (-37.2%); *Other services except public administration* (-9.0%); and *Public administration* (-1.1%).

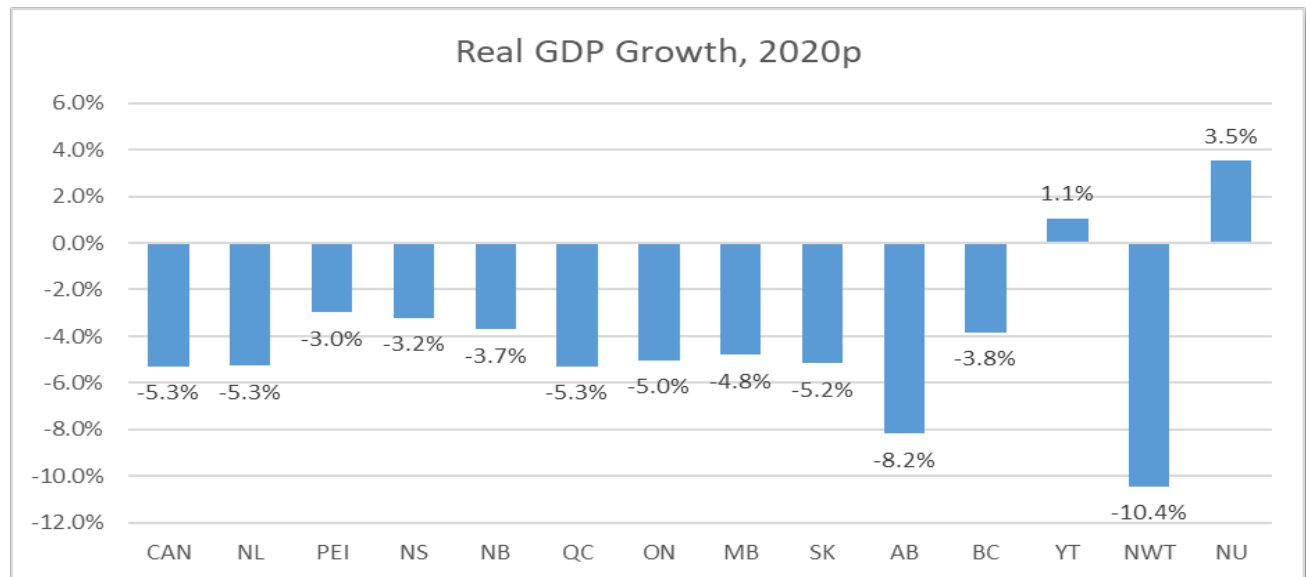
