What will I experience?

- The opportunity to learn and practice through remote field work, research, educational and outreach programming, leadership and group management and more.
- Transferable training opportunities to set you up for a safe and productive season.
- Teamwork! A culture centered around good people, good work and good fun.
- Personal and professional growth linked to making positive impacts for the community and the environment.

When will I work?

- Post-secondary contracts run from May- August
- High school Fieldworker contracts run from late June-August
- Start and end dates are specific to each position and include extensive paid training.

Where will I work?

 All over the Yukon! Project locations change yearly based on requests. Expect a balance of remote, local, single day and multiday projects in several Yukon communities and surrounding forests, lakes and rivers. Our office is based in Whitehorse.

Who will I work with?

- Work alongside biologists, researchers, parks employees, NGOs and local community members.
- Work with elementary and secondary students through EnviroWild camp and spring programs in schools.
- Like-minded students make up the Y2C2 and EnviroWild camp crews.

Job descriptions

Y2C2 green team steward (post-secondary student position)

The job: Oversee the implementation of hands-on conservation related projects in various locations around the territory. May include public presentations, research, updating learning resources, web and publication design, delivery of conservation camps and biology fieldwork. This position also works closely with the Youth Programs coordinator to organize special events, plan and provide staff trainings, schedule projects and provide administrative support.

You: Post-secondary student with coursework in renewable resources, biology and/or outdoor environmental education. Thrive on working with people, including youth from K to 12. Has Yukon drivers licence (Class 5).

Pay and length of contract: \$21.64/hr for 16 weeks. Second year \$23.15/hr. One position available.

Y2C2 green team worker (post-secondary student position)

The job: Works collaboratively with a team on a variety of conservation related programs across Yukon. May include hands-on research, public presentations, biology fieldwork, data input, and delivery of educational programs, conservation camps, and "greening" events.

You: Post-secondary student with coursework in renewable resources, biology and/or outdoor environmental education. Thrives on working with people, including youth from K-12. Has Yukon drivers licence (Class 5).

Pay and length of contract: \$20.19/hr for 13 weeks. Second year \$21.64/hr. Three positions available.

Camp assistant (post-secondary student position)

The job: Responsible for all aspects of planning and delivery of 3 summer camps for youth 12 to 15 years of age. Organizes equipment and food, supervises campers and works collaboratively with colleaders. Trips are up to 10 days in length. Works alongside, and is strongly supported by, the Youth Programs coordinator. Must acquire Class 4 driver's licence – covered as part of training!

You: Post-secondary student with coursework in renewable resources, biology and/or outdoor/environmental/experiential education. Experience supervising youth, preferably in a camp environment. Considerable outdoor experience. Looking to further their leadership, mentoring, education and facilitation skills as well as gain wilderness-guiding experience.

Pay and length of contract: \$20.19/hr for 13 weeks + camp bonus. Second year \$21.64/hr. Two positions available.

Job descriptions (continued)

Y2C2 crew leader (post-secondary student position)

The job: Supervises the day-to-day activities of a crew of four Field Workers. Drives transport vehicle, organizes field camps and equipment, ensures worker safety and maintains positive work environment.

You: Post-secondary student with coursework in relevant field, some experience in project management and supervision, strong safety consciousness, adaptable, reliable. Looking to increase leadership and project management capacities. Has Yukon drivers licence (Class 5).

Pay and length of contract: \$23.15/hr for 13 weeks + camp bonus. Second year \$24.77. Two positions available.

Y2C2 field worker (high school student position)

The job: Works cooperatively with your team on a variety of conservation-related projects around the territory. Outdoor labour using hand tools as well as research-oriented tasks. Education and training offered in orientation camp and throughout the summer.

You: High school student with an interest in environment, conservation, and some experience working, volunteering and playing in the outdoors. Responsible and enthusiastic. Looking to gain insight and experience in environmental work.

Work period can include up to a 10-day shift.

Pay and length of contract: \$18.45/hr for 8 weeks. Second year \$19.29/hr. Eight positions available.

*These contracts run from mid-June to early August to accommodate students in Grades 11 and 12. Applications for these positions are due by **April 28, 2024**
