



Information for people entering Yukon

If you are required to quarantine after entering Canada from international travel, you must follow Government of Canada regulations. <https://travel.gc.ca/travel-covid/travel-restrictions/isolation>

Mandatory Masks

- You must wear a mask in all indoor public spaces in Yukon.

If you are entering into Yukon, you must self-isolate for 14 days

There are two options to self-isolate.

- Alone or with your travel companion(s) in a place that is not shared with any others.
- In a shared space where all household members will also be required to self-isolate.
 - Fully vaccinated household members who have not travelled do not have to self-isolate but must stay physically distanced from the traveller.

Exceptions to self-isolation

You do not have to **fully** self-isolate when you arrive in Yukon if:

- you've received your final dose of a vaccine, approved for use in Canada, at least 14 days before entering the territory. However:
 - You must complete a declaration form upon entry declaring you are fully vaccinated.
 - You must consent to having your vaccine status verified.
 - If you received your vaccination shots in Yukon or British Columbia, and you provide consent* for verification, the Government of Yukon will be able to access your health records.
 - If you received your vaccination shots outside of Yukon and British Columbia, you may be asked to submit proof of vaccination. **
- you're a critical service worker who has entered Yukon in the course of carrying out your duties (see section below for more info); or
- a resident of border areas including Atlin, Lower Post, Fire Side, Jade City, Fraser or Pleasant Camp.

*Note: If you provided consent to the collection, use and disclosure of your personal health information, **you have the right to withdraw your consent. Contact info on reverse.**

**Details on how to submit proof of vaccination will be shared separately.

Transiting through Yukon to or from Alaska or other parts of Canada:

- You must complete your transit through Yukon within 24 hours from the time of your entry.
- You must follow the most direct route through Yukon along the designated highway. Route maps may be given to you by a border officer when you enter Yukon.
- Do not enter Whitehorse or rural communities, except if the route you must take passes through.

- If you get gas, food or other essential services, only access those services on the route.
- If you must stop for the night only access accommodations on the most direct route through Yukon and self-isolate in your room.
- You must not camp at campgrounds operated by the Government of Yukon.
- If you're outside your vehicle, wear a mask or face covering and practise physical distancing.
- If you develop COVID-19 symptoms (such as cough, fever or difficulty breathing), call 811.

Critical service providers arriving in Yukon for or from work

Critical services are services required to preserve life, health and basic societal functioning and are delivered by specific types of workers. Critical service workers are not required to self-isolate in certain situations but must follow recommendations from the Chief Medical Officer of Health:

- Self-isolate when you are not providing the identified critical service.
- Avoid travel outside Yukon unless it is required as part of delivering the critical service.
- Self-monitor daily for signs and symptoms of COVID-19.
- Follow protocols for infection prevention and control including proper hand hygiene.
- Avoid gatherings as much as possible and practise physical distancing.
- Do not share items like electronics, personal protective equipment, food, cigarettes and vaping devices.
- Report to your superiors and a health care practitioner if you develop symptoms or come into contact with anyone who has COVID-19.

Non-compliance with the *Civil Emergency Measures Act* orders

Anyone who fails to obey the following orders may be subject to a fine or imprisonment:

- As of December 1, 2020, you must wear a mask in all indoor public spaces in Yukon.
- Self-isolate for 14 days if you are arriving and are required to self-isolate.
- Transit through Yukon within 24 hours along only the most direct route.
- Do not gather in groups of more than 10 people indoors or 50 outdoors.

What recommendations have been issued?

- The Chief Medical Officer of Health asks that people practise physical distancing and stay 2 metres away from others.
- The Chief Medical Officer of Health advises everyone to limit travel to rural communities (all communities outside Whitehorse).
- If you are travelling to a community follow any travel advisories issued by First Nations governments, municipalities or communities.
- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water or use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Stay home if you are feeling sick
