| <ul> <li>Ca</li> <li>Re<br/>isc</li> <li>Inc<br/>sci</li> </ul>  | <ul> <li>Beginning October 1, on-site road border personnel are transitioning from the current 24-hours a day schedule to 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the Alaska Highway and Junction 37 borders.         <ul> <li>Travellers arriving outside of these hours will be required to stop at an on-site kiosk.</li> <li>They must sign a declaration and submit their self-isolation plan, along with a contact number when they arrive from outside of BC, the NWT or Nunavut.</li> <li>Completing the self-declaration is required by law.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Canada and the U.S. have extended border closures to non-essential travel until September 21.</li> <li>Residents of BC, Nunavut, NWT and Yukon are allowed to travel in those jurisdictions without the need to self-isolate for 14 days in Yukon.</li> <li>Individuals entering Yukon's airports must wear a mask and the Government of Canada require temperature screenings for all passengers.</li> </ul> |  |   |   |   |  |
