Terms and conditions

Definitions:

Applicant – for the purpose of this form, the applicant is the vendor or primary provider of eligible goods, products and services.

Base trim – the entry level, most basic version of a particular vehicle model.

BEV – Battery electric vehicle. Must be powered exclusively by a battery and electric motor with no back-up internal combustion engine.

Client – individual who is a Yukon resident, purchased eligible goods and services and received a rebate from the applicant.

Electric cargo bicycles – Have an extended frame designed to carry goods or people.

km/h – kilometer per hour

kWh – kilowatt-hour

MSRP – Manufacturer Suggested Retail Price

NVIS – New Vehicle Information Statement

PHEV – Plug-in Hybrid Electric Vehicle is powered by a battery and electric motor with a back-up internal combustion engine.

Trim – the different versions of a particular vehicle model.

W – Watt

ZEV - Zero Emission Vehicle. ZEVs have the potential to operate without producing direct tailpipe emissions. Vehicle models may still

have a conventional internal combustion engine, but must also be able to operate without it.

Eligible applicants: The applicant must be a business registered in the Yukon in good standing with the Government of Yukon. The applicant must be the primary provider of goods and services, as shown by the supporting documentation. The applicant must have issued an invoice to the client that clearly shows a Government of Yukon Good Energy Clean Transportation Rebate was applied.

Eligible clients: Businesses and organizations registered in the Yukon; municipalities; First Nation governments; and Yukon residents. The Government of Yukon and federal government entities, including crown corporations, are ineligible. Dealerships may only offer point of sale rebates to those who have Yukon residency at the time of purchase. Yukon residency is proven by showing a Yukon driver’s license or one eligible document from the Government of Yukon’s [residency document list](#) to the applicant.

Eligibility: ZEVs, electric motorcycles, zero emission snowmobiles, electric bicycles and electric cargo bicycles must be purchased new. Used electric motorcycles, zero-emission snowmobiles, electric bicycles and electric cargo bicycles are not eligible. Used ZEVs are only eligible

for a shipping rebate. Receipts and invoices must be dated within 1 year of submitting your rebate application. The date of the invoice is considered to be the date of the most recent payment on the invoice. If applicant has a lease agreement, the rebate will be pro-rated on the length of the lease. The applicant can qualify for the full rebate if the lease is 3 years or more.

Quantity: For all Good Energy clean transportation rebates, businesses and organizations registered in the Yukon, municipalities, and First Nations governments may purchase up to 10 qualifying vehicle per rebate per calendar year. Yukon residents may purchase two qualifying vehicle per rebate over the lifespan of the program.

To be eligible for a vendor-issued rebate, **new ZEV** must:

- Be operated by a:
 - battery-electric motor;
 - hydrogen fuel-cell motor;
 - plug-in hybrid electric motor with an all-electric range of 50 kilometres or greater; or
 - plug-in hybrid electric motor with an all-electric range of less than 50 kilometres. **Note:** Plug-in hybrid electric vehicles are powered by a battery and electric motor with a back-up internal combustion engine.
- Have a MSRP for the base trim of that particular model that is below \$60,000 (excluding optional equipment, federal air conditioner excise tax, freight, accessories, and other fees). Higher priced versions of the same vehicle model are eligible, provided the MSRP of the base vehicle model is below the threshold; and
- Have a new vehicle information statement (NVIS).

Not eligible are: Conventional hybrid vehicles that do not plug-in.

To be eligible for a vendor-issued rebate, **used ZEV** must be:

- Operated by: a battery-electric motor; a hydrogen fuel cell motor; or plug-in hybrid electric technology. **Note:** Plug-in hybrid electric vehicles are powered by a battery and electric motor with a back-up internal combustion engine;
- Previously registered in a jurisdiction other than the Yukon; and
- Shipped into the Yukon Territory.

A used ZEV can only receive a shipping rebate once. A ZEV cannot be eligible for both the used ZEV shipping rebate and the new ZEV rebate.

Not eligible are: Conventional hybrid vehicles that do not plug-in.

To be eligible for a vendor-issued rebate, **electric motorcycles** must:

- Be powered exclusively by an electric motor and battery;
- Require a Yukon driver's license to operate (any class);
- Have two or three wheels; and
- Meet all requirements under the Yukon's *Motor Vehicles Act*.

Qualifying electric motorcycles include both high speed and limited speed motorcycles as defined by the *Motor Vehicles Act*.

To be eligible for a vendor-issued rebate, **zero emission snowmobiles** must:

- Be powered by an eligible technology such as battery-electric or hydrogen fuel cell; and
- Meet all requirements under the Yukon's *Motor Vehicles Act*.

To be eligible for a vendor-issued rebate, **electric bicycles and electric cargo bicycles** must have pedals.

A cargo bicycle must have an extended frame designed to carry additional people or cargo.

Full suspension electric bicycles designed exclusively for mountain biking qualify for this rebate.

Not eligible are:

- Electric conversion kits;
- Electric motorbikes without pedals;
- Bicycles purchased on crowd-funding campaign websites, such as Kickstarter, or Indiegogo.

The rebate for electric bicycles, electric cargo bicycles, and electric motorcycles is calculated and based on the cost of vehicle only and excludes the costs for accessories, shipping, assembly, etc. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that both the client and the client's

transportation product are eligible for a rebate. The Government of Yukon is not responsible for any financial loss to the applicant resulting from discounts issued for products that are determined to be ineligible for a Good Energy Clean Transportation Rebate by the Government of Yukon.

Receipts and invoices: Receipts, invoices and required documents must be legible, itemized and include: purchase date, purchaser name, retailer/supplier name, brands and model numbers of items purchased, description and cost. Where applicable, supplied invoices must include the applicant's name on this form. **Every invoice must have a zero balance owing or be noted as "paid in full" and initialed by the supplier.** Payment will be made to the individual or business identified on this application form. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that any other parties that may have participated in the purchase or project are aware of this rebate application and approve of these terms.

Limits to program: The Good Energy program is renewed annually pending fiscal year budget allocation. **This program is effective from April 1 to March 31 of a fiscal year. The program expires on March 31 unless it is renewed.** Rebate offers are subject to program funding and revision and may change or end at any time. The Government of Yukon does not give rebates that are more than the product, project or service value.

Applications and payment: Receipts, invoices and required documents must be dated within one year of the date application package is submitted to the Energy Branch. The Government of Yukon is not responsible for lost, late, misdirected, damaged, illegible, incomplete, or ineligible applications. Payment will be made to the applicant identified on this form. The client waives their right to the rebate for the products and services purchased in lieu of receiving a Government of Yukon Good Energy Clean Transportation Rebate discount on these products and services directly from the applicant. The applicant should allow up to 12 weeks for payment. Payment may be done by direct deposit if you have been under contract with the Government of Yukon.

Qualifying products: The Government of Yukon's Energy Branch relies on third-party standards to identify and validate energy efficient products, projects and services. In promoting these standards, the Energy Branch does not endorse any particular manufacturer, supplier, contractor or installer.

Personal information: Collection of this information is authorized by paragraph 15(c)(i) of the *Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Act* SY 2018, c.9 to determine whether you are eligible for a Good Energy rebate, issue payment, and provide you with updates to the Good Energy rebate program.
