



## **APPLICATION FOR COMPENSATION FOR LOSS OF ANIMAL AND COSTS OF COMPLIANCE**

Pursuant to the *Animal Health Act* and *Animal Health Regulation*

You are eligible to apply for monetary compensation if you incurred costs or losses because you were required to comply with an order or a direction issued under the *Animal Health Act* by an inspector or the Chief Veterinary Officer.

You can apply once:

- the order you are complying with has expired or is revoked;
- you have confirmation you complied with a direction; or
- any investigation under the Act is completed.

This application must be received by the Animal Health Unit within 60 days of the date on which you are eligible to apply.

This form does NOT apply to funding you may be eligible for to improve fencing or to supplement the amount you received from the sale of animals. In those cases, please contact the Agriculture Branch for assistance.

### **Refusal of applications**

Applications will be refused in certain situations, as prescribed in the *Animal Health Act*, Section 48 and *Animal Health Regulation*, Section 10. This is referred to in Part 3 of this application. Please contact the Animal Health Unit for additional information. You may be asked for additional information to support your application.

### **Appeal**

If this application is refused, you may appeal the refusal within 30 days of receiving written reasons for its refusal. Please contact the Animal Health Unit for assistance.

**Compensation for animal loss**

Maximum compensation amounts are determined by the federal *Compensation for Destroyed Animals Regulations*, SOR/2000-233. These maximum amounts do not distinguish between adult and juvenile animals. In Yukon, compensation for juvenile animals is up to 50% of the maximum amount for adult animals.

For sheep and goats specifically, a juvenile animal is defined as up to four months of age. Compensation amounts in Yukon for sheep and goats differ from the federal *Compensation for Destroyed Animals Regulations*, and are outlined in the table below:
