One of the most common birds seen in summer. Distinct white feathers on outside of tail.



Yellow-rumped Warbler The "Myrtle" sub-species that has a white throat.




White-winged Crossbill

Males = red; females = yellow. Bill looks deformed but is specially designed for opening seeds.



Black-capped Chickadee Easiest call to mimic. Seriously, it's just





Mountain Bluebird

Makes use of human-made boxes for their homes. It's blue, so it kind of stands out.



Yellow Warbler

It's bright yellow, so you'd think you would see it more often.



White-crowned Sparrow

Rather plain except for those zebra stripes on its head.



Pine Grosbeak

Similar colours to crossbills, but it's big and fat with a chunky bill for crushing seeds.



Boreal Chickadee

Just like the other chickadee, but with brown. Still super cute.



Ruby-crowned Kinglet Little tiny bird with a big song.



Wilson's Warbler

Just like the Yellow Warbler, but males have that adorable black hat.



Pine Siskin

Mostly brown, but with a yellow tint. Can decimate bird feeders.



Common Redpoll

Both sexes have red caps, but only males have a pink chest.



Red-breasted Nuthatch

Lands on the sides of trees, facing downwards.



Bohemian Waxwing

Eats the fermented berries on ash trees, which sometimes get them a little tipsy.
