

# Squishy juicy things



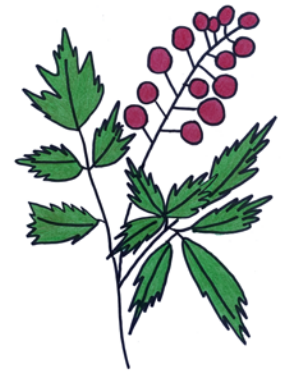
**Wild Raspberry**

Grows in sunny places and sandy soil.



**High-bush Cranberry**

Not actually related to cranberries.  
Smell like stinky socks.



**Baneberry**

Nice to look at, not to eat.  
Poisonous!



**Kinnikinnik**

Leaves are tear-drop shaped.  
Berries are bright red and mealy.



**Low-bush Cranberry**

Similar to Kinnikinnik, but leaves are oval-shaped.  
Berries are dark red and juicy.



**Saskatoon Berry**

Shrubs can be short, or grow tall, like a tree.



**Cloudberry**

Found in the alpine on very small plants  
that are close to the ground.



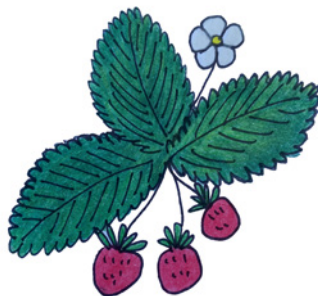
**Currants**

Black Currants and Red Currants both grow wild  
in the Yukon. (But not on the same plant).



**Soapberry**

The most important food source for  
many animals of the boreal forest.



**Wild Strawberry**

Tastes way better than cultivated strawberries,  
but it's very small.



**Mossberry/Crowberry**

Dark blue-to-black berries.  
Mostly tasteless, but also harmless.



**Huckleberry/High-bush Blueberry**

Found along river banks or at higher elevations.
