Squishy juicy things



Wild Raspberry Grows in sunny places and sandy soil.



Kinnikinnik

Leaves are tear-drop shaped. Berries are bright red and mealy.



Cloudberry Found in the alpine on very small plants

that are close to the ground.



Wild Strawberry Tastes way better than cultivated strawberries, but it's very small.



High-bush Cranberry

Not actually related to cranberries. Smell like stinky socks.



Low-bush Cranberry

Similar to Kinnikinnik, but leaves are oval-shaped. Berries are dark red and juicy.



Currants

Black Currants and Red Currants both grow wild in the Yukon. (But not on the same plant).



Mossberry/Crowberry

Dark blue-to-black berries. Mostly tasteless, but also harmless.



Baneberry Nice to look at, not to eat. Poisonous!



Saskatoon Berry Shrubs can be short, or grow tall, like a tree.



Soapberry The most important food source for many animals of the boreal forest.



Huckleberry/High-bush Blueberry

Found along river banks or at higher elevations.
