• Yukon Ambulance Services provides emergency transportation for residents and nonresidents throughout the Territory. In Whitehorse, the ambulance station are staffed 24 hours a day by ground and air ambulance practitioners. In communities, services are provided by on-call volunteers with and in Dawson City and Watson Lake with both paid and volunteer responders.
