



KNOW THE RISKS

Antipsychotics are a large class of medications used to help regulate the functioning of brain circuits that control thinking, mood and perception.

Antipsychotics act on the central nervous system and should not be used in combination with alcohol due to the risk of enhanced side effects of one or both medications.



Antipsychotic medication

These include:

- risperidone (such as Risperdal)
- quetiapine (such as Seroquel)
- olanzapine (such as Zyprexa)
- ziprasidone (such as Zeldox)
- paliperidone (such as Invega)
- aripiprazole (such as Abilify)
- clozapine (such as Clozaril)

Common side effects:

- blurred vision
- drowsiness
- muscle spasms or tremors
- impaired thinking or judgement
