



COVID-19 Testing recommendations – Whitehorse 2020-03-20

1. Who to test

Other factors that raise the index of suspicion should also be considered (e.g. being a patient on the ward during a nosocomial respiratory outbreak, attending a large international gathering, being on a cruise ship). Contact CMOH for				

All persons investigated must be reported by fax to YCDC

Immediate reporting by phone call is required for all persons investigated who may be part of a larger Yukon cluster: hospitalized cases, long term care facilities (residents or staff), health care providers, large gatherings or greater than 5 close contacts.

To further prioritize results: include on the requisition if the sample source, is in one of the following priority groups:

- Hospital (label as HOSP)
- Long-term care facility (label as LTCF)
- Health Care Worker (label as HCW)

2. How to test: collect specimen, complete the BCCDC PHL virology requisition, write "COVID-19" on requisitions.

There are now, three options for collection:

- red top viral collection kits,
- blue top viral collection kits,
- Hologic Aptima (unisex urethral swabs- CT/GC NAAT) has been validated by BCCDC for respiratory viral including COVID-19

Specimen:

- In the outpatient setting, collect 1 Nasopharyngeal swab (NP)
- Patients with severe respiratory illness or hospitalized patients should have multiple samples collected: a NP and a Throat Swab or sputum, endotracheal aspirate, or Bronchoalveolar lavage.

3. All persons tested for COVID-19 should be isolated from others

Patients requiring hospitalization: placed in a separate room on contact and droplet precautions

Patients well enough to go home must be provided education and placed on home isolation.

Provide the attached handout Information about the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) Self-isolating at home (see https://yukon.ca/novel-coronavirus-hp) and let them know that YCDC will contact them.

If the person being investigated requires direct care in the home setting (ie children, elderly), also provide <u>Information about the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) for caregivers</u> (see https://yukon.ca/novel-coronavirus-hp)

Patients in Whitehorse will be followed by YCDC.

4. Notify YCDC of all persons tested for COVID-19 – see page one

YCDC will support persons on home isolation, who have meet the testing criteria and inform them of their test results. Home isolation is critical to controlling community spread of this virus. All persons meeting COVID-19 testing criteria must be on self-isolation.
