To parents, guardians, students and staff of **Nlaye Ndasadaye Daycare**,

Yukon Communicable Disease Control (YCDC) has been made aware of a positive case of COVID-19 at Nlaye Ndasadaye Daycare affecting the:

- Transition Group, from January 19 to 21

All staff and students who attended or worked in the above class have been identified as close 'contacts' of COVID-19. YCDC has completed a careful risk assessment and the clinical care direction for students and staff attending or working in the above classes is:

- A. self-isolate until January 28 inclusive, and self-monitor for symptoms through February 4, if:
  - you are not fully immunized to COVID-19 (as described below in Section B).
- B. self-monitor for symptoms through February 4, if:
  - you are not significantly immunosuppressed due to illness or medication; AND
  - have received 2 doses of COVID-19 immunization, with the 2<sup>nd</sup> dose received after July 19 and before January 5; OR
  - have received 3 doses (2 doses + 1 booster) of COVID-19 immunization before January 5; OR
  - you have been diagnosed with lab confirmed COVID-19 in the last 90 days.

It is very important that if any symptoms develop, no matter how mild, you do not go to work or school and follow the current guidance on Yukon.ca. COVID-19 is a respiratory illness that is spread through droplets when a person coughs, speaks, or touches surfaces contaminated by the virus and then touches their face before washing their hands.

Symptoms to self-monitor for include:

Symptoms of COVID-19 may be mild or severe and often have a different presentation in persons who are very young or older persons. While most people will experience mild illness, older adults and people with pre-existing medical conditions are at higher risk for severe illness.
